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SYNOPSIS

Existing law requires businesses that sell alcoholic beverages to train their employees under the 7 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board's Responsible Vendor Program. The law further provides that the course of instruction and test may be given online.

> This bill would further implement the law by directing the board to adopt rules that recognize and enable vendors to conduct the program online. This bill provides that an employee who scores 70 percent or higher on the test has successfully completed the course.

This bill further provides that if the board fails to adopt the rules within four months of the bill's enactment, the board will lose its authorization to operate retail liquor stores.

This bill would also delete duplicative language and make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

42	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
43	Section 1. Section 28-10-6, Code of Alabama 1975, is
44	amended to read as follows:
45	" §28-10-6
46	(a) In order to qualify for certification, the vendor
47	shall comply with the following requirements:
48	(1) Provide a course of instruction for its employees
49	approved by the board which shall include subjects dealing
50	with alcoholic beverages as follows:
51	a. Laws regarding the sale of alcoholic beverages for
52	on-the-premises consumption and/or for off-the-premisessale
53	for on-premises or off-premises consumption.
54	b. Methods of recognizing and dealing with underage
55	customers.
56	c. The development of specific procedures Procedures for

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refusing sale to sell alcoholic beverages to underage

customers, ; for assisting employees in dealing with underage

customers; and for dealing with handling intoxicated

customers.

- (2) Require each employee who is authorized to sell alcoholic beverages in the normal course of his or her employment to complete the employee training course of instruction set out in subdivision (1) and to achieve a passing grade of 70 percent or higher on a test of the course subjects within 30 days of commencing employment. Responsible vendor training or testing may be conducted online by computer, in a classroom, or by live trainers. Any online training must include employee testing to pass. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to require an in-person test administrator or proctor.
 - (3) Require all trained employees to attend additional meetings at least semiannually or such other schedule of meetings on another periodic basis as may be approved by the board, by rule, which meetings shall include the dissemination of existing and new information presentation of additional information covering the applicable subjects specified in this section and explaining an explanation of the vendor's policies and procedures relating to those subjects.
 - (4) Maintain employment records of the training of its employees required by this section. The records, which may be maintained kept in a digital format, provided the records may can be produced within 48 hours at the request of the board.

103	subdivision (1), the board may no longer operate any liquor
