4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Certain psychoactive compounds, including
6	delta-8-tetrahydrocannabinol (delta-8 THC),
7	delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (Delta-9 THC), and
8	delta-10-tetrahydrocannabinol (delta-10 THC) can be
9	manufactured in concentrated amounts from hemp-derived
10	cannabidiol (CBD).
11	Under existing law, psychoactive cannabinoids
12	may not be sold to minors and must be located in an
13	area where minors cannot access the products.
14	This bill would prohibit the sale of any
15	beverage that contains any amount of psychoactive
16	cannabinoids, except as permitted under the medical
17	cannabis laws.
18	This bill would also provide that delta-9-THC is
19	specifically included in the definition of psychoactive
20	cannabinoids for purposes of the law.

- 52 shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.
- (e) Any individual under 21 years of age who is in

- 57 hundred dollars (\$200) for each violation or community service
- in equal value of the fine and shall be assessed no other
- 59 court costs or fees. In addition, on a third or subsequent
- 60 conviction, including convictions in district court or
- 61 municipal court, the individual shall be issued a citation
- 62 similar to a uniform nontraffic citation and shall be fined
- four hundred dollars (\$400) for each violation or community
- 64 service in equal value of the fine.
- (f) Any psychoactive cannabinoids sold in this state
- shall be packaged in child-resistant containers."

- amount of psychoactive cannabinoids may be lawfully sold in

- 77 (c) Any person who sells, distributes, or markets a
- 78 beverage containing psychoactive cannabinoids in violation of
- 79 this section shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.
- 80 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
- 81 1, 2025.
