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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, an individual seeking
6	compensation from the Alabama Crime Victims
7	Compensation Commission must file a claim within one
8	year of the injury or death upon which the claim is
9	based.
10	This bill would provide that an individual
11	seeking compensation from the Alabama Crime Victims
12	Compensation Commission may file a claim within two
13	years of the injury or death upon which the claim is
14	based.
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17	A BILL
18	TO BE ENTITLED
19	AN ACT
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21	Relating to the Alabama Crime Victims Compensation
22	Commission; to amend Section 15-23-12, Code of Alabama 1975,
23	to further provide for the filing of claims.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 15-23-12, Code of Alabama 1975, is
26	amended to read as follows:
27	"\$15-23-12
28	(a) Compensation shall not be awarded in any of the



29 following circumstances:

30 (1) A claim has been filed with the commission later
31 than one year two years after the injury or death upon which
32 the claim is based, unless the commission finds there was good
33 cause for the failure to file within that time.

34 (2) To a claimant who was the offender, or an
 35 accomplice of the offender, or who encouraged or in any way
 36 participated in the criminally injurious conduct.

37 (3) If the award would unjustly benefit the offender or38 accomplice of the offender.

39 (4) The criminally injurious conduct resulting in 40 injury or death was reported to a law enforcement officer 41 later than 72 hours after its occurrence, unless the 42 commission finds there was good cause for the failure to 43 report within that time.

(b) Compensation otherwise payable to a claimant may be diminished or denied to the extent that the economic loss is recouped from collateral sources; or to the extent that the degree of responsibility for the cause of the injury or death is attributable to the victim as determined by the commission.

49 (c) The commission, upon finding that the claimant or 50 victim has not fully cooperated with appropriate law 51 enforcement agencies, may deny, withdraw, or reduce an award 52 of compensation.

(d) The commission, on its own motion or on request of the claimant, may reconsider a decision granting or denying an award or determining <u>its</u> an award amount. An order on reconsideration of an award shall not require a refund of

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57	amounts previously paid, unless the award was obtained by
58	fraud. The right of reconsideration does not affect the
59	finality of a commission decision for the purpose of judicial
60	review."
61	Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
62	1, 2025.
