SYNOPSIS:

This bill would establish the crime of failure 5 6 to render aid, which would be committed if, while 7 engaged in the illegal use of a controlled substance 8 with another: (i) a person knowingly fails to seek medical assistance for another individual suffering 9 from an overdose of the controlled substance or 10 11 suffering a significant adverse physical reaction to the controlled substance; and (ii) the overdose or 12 13 adverse physical reaction proximately causes the death of the other individual. 14
