22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
24	following terms have the following meanings:
25	(1) FOREIGN ADVERSARY. The term as defined in 15 C.F.R
26	§ 7.4.
27	(2) GOVERNMENTAL BODY. The term as defined in Section

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28 41-4-114, Code of Alabama 1975.

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- 29 (3) GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. The term as defined in Section 30 11-93-1, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 31 (4) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM. The term as defined in 32 Section 13A-7-4.3, Code of Alabama 1975.
- 33 (b) A governmental body or governmental entity shall 34 not purchase or use any of the following unmanned aircraft 35 systems:
- 36 (1) A system manufactured in a foreign adversary.
- 37 (2) A system manufactured or sold by a company owned by
 38 any business, corporation, or other entity located in or
 39 subordinate to a foreign adversary.
- 40 (3) A system manufactured or sold by a subsidiary,
 41 affiliate, or representative of a business, corporation, or
 42 other entity located in or subordinate to a foreign adversary.
- 43 (4) A system that contains at least 50 percent of its
 44 parts or components manufactured, supplied, owned, or
 45 controlled by any business, corporation, or other entity
 46 located in or subordinate to a foreign adversary.
- 47 (5) A system that sends information to a foreign adversary.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2025.
