- 31 (5) The individual has at least five years of prior 32 full-time service as a law enforcement officer having the 33 power of arrest, certified by the commission.
- 34 (6) The individual has never been convicted of a felony 35 criminal offense in this state nor been convicted of a 36 criminal offense in another jurisdiction that would qualify as 37 a felony if committed in this state.
- 38 (7) The individual is currently certified by and in 39 good standing with the commission on the qualification date or 40 appointment date.
- from full-time active law enforcement, certified by the
 commission, for more than five consecutive years immediately
 prior to the qualification date or appointment date; or the
 individual has obtained a recertification of full-time active
 law enforcement status as a law enforcement officer from the
 commission.

- Section 2. Beginning June 1, 2025, any individual serving as the Sheriff of Barbour County shall attend a minimum of 12 hours of executive level continuing education training approved by the Alabama Sheriffs Association, the National Sheriffs' Association, or any other recognized executive level continuing education training designed for law enforcement.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on June 1, 2025.
