21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. (a) The Attorney General or Governor, in
23	consultation with one another, may appoint an interim police
24	chief to superintend any municipal police department if he or
25	she determines that a particular and ongoing threat to public
26	safety exists within a municipality after doing all of the
27	following:

(1) Reviewing relevant and pertinent federal, state,

- 30 (2) Determining that the number of law enforcement
 31 officers employed by the municipality's police department is
 32 30 or more percent less than the average number of law
- enforcement officers employed by that police department for

- 35 (3) Consulting with the district attorney of the 36 circuit in which the municipality is located.
- 37 (4) Consulting with the sheriff of the county in which 38 the municipality is located.
- 39 (5) Consulting with victims of crimes committed within 40 the municipality.
 - (b) The interim police chief shall serve under the authority and at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority and shall not be subject to the authority of the mayor, city council, or other official of the municipality.
 - (c) The interim police chief shall serve until the Attorney General or Governor, in consultation with one another, determines that a particular and ongoing threat to public safety no longer exists within the municipality after satisfying all of the actions required in subsection (a).
 - (d) The interim police chief shall be paid a salary with funds from the operating account of his or her appointing authority. The salary shall be set at the discretion of the appointing authority.
- (e) The appointing authority may petition the circuit court of the county in which the municipality is located for the recoupment of any costs incurred in enforcing this

- 57 section, including the payment of the interim police chief's
- 58 salary. If the court finds that the actions required in

- appointing authority all costs associated with the enforcement

- (f) The interim police chief shall be considered an
- officer of the state for purposes of Section 36-1-12, Code of
- 65 Alabama 1975.
- (g) The interim police chief shall provide a
- 67 semimonthly report of the current status of, and the remedial
- 68 actions being taken by, the police department to the mayor and
- 69 city council of the municipality.
- 70 (h) The sheriff of the county in which the municipality
- 71 is located may be appointed to serve as the interim police
- 72 chief. If appointed, the sheriff shall be entitled to
- additional compensation pursuant to subsection (d), not to
- exceed seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) per year.
- 75 (i) (1) A municipality with an interim police chief

- a. Continue to fund the police department in a manner

- (2) A municipality that violates this subsection may
 not receive any funds, grants, or appropriations from the
 State of Alabama until the violation has ceased, as determined
 by the Attorney General or Governor, in consultation with one
 another.
- 92 Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately.
