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4	SYNOPSIS:			
5	This bill would amend the definition of a High			
6	Poverty School as related to the School Principal			
7	Leadership and Mentoring Act.			
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10	A BILL			
11	TO BE ENTITLED			
12	AN ACT			
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14	Relating to the School Principal Leadership and			
15	Mentoring Act; to amend Section 16-6I-2, Code of Alabama 1975			
16	to revise the definition used to determine eligibility of			
17	principals and assistant principals to receive annual			
18	stipends.			
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:			
20	Section 1. Section 16-6I-2 of the Code of Alabama 1975,			
21	is amended to read as follows:			
22	"§16-6I-2			
23	For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms			
24	shall have the following meanings:			
25	(1) BOARD. The State Board of Education.			
26	(2) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Education.			
27	(3) DESIGN TEAM. The group of individuals appointed to			
28	design the Alabama Principal Leadership Development System			



- 29 including, but not limited to, school leadership standards,
- 30 principal leadership framework, design of a leadership
- 31 academy, ongoing professional learning, mentoring, evaluation
- 32 system, or any other aspect the design team determines
- 33 necessary for the growth and development of successful school
- 34 administrators.
- 35 (4) HIGH-POVERTY SCHOOL. A school that has a free and
- 36 reduced federal lunch student percentage of 75 percent or
- 37 greater as determined by the most recent data posted or that
- 38 provides meals to all students through the community
- 39 eligibility provision.
- 40 (5) LOW-PERFORMING SCHOOL. Any school that is
- 41 identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement School,
- 42 a Targeted Support and Improvement School, an Additional
- 43 Targeted Support and Improvement School, a school with a D or
- 44 F grade as defined by the Alabama Education Report Card,
- Chapter 6C, or a full support school or limited support school
- 46 as defined by the Alabama Literacy Act, Chapter 6G, or the
- 47 Alabama Numeracy Act, Chapter 6H.
- 48 (6) MENTORING. A long-term relationship between a new
- 49 principal mentee and a trained principal mentor that fosters
- 50 the professional, academic, or personal development of the
- 51 principal mentee.
- 52 (7) NEW PRINCIPAL. A principal who is serving in his or
- 53 her first or second year as a principal.
- 54 (8) PRINCIPAL. An individual who is certified for the
- position of principal, as prescribed by the board, and who is
- 56 employed full-time by a local board of education as the chief



- 57 school administrator of a public school.
- 58 (9) PRINCIPAL MENTEE. A new principal who is
- 59 participating in a mentoring relationship with a more
- 60 experienced principal through which the principal may further
- define and articulate core values, grow instructional
- leadership competencies, and develop professional confidence.
- (10) PRINCIPAL MENTOR. An experienced school
- 64 administrator who guides new principals in defining and
- 65 articulating core values, growing instructional leadership
- 66 competencies, and developing professional confidence.
- 67 (11) PROFESSIONAL LEARNING. A comprehensive, sustained,
- 68 job-embedded, and collaborative approach to improving the
- 69 effectiveness of principals in elevating student achievement
- 70 through professional study.
- 71 (12) PROFESSIONAL LEARNING UNIT. A content-driven,
- 72 long-term unit of professional study for instructional leaders
- 73 that fully addresses all knowledge and ability indicators
- 74 under at least one of the Alabama Standards for School
- 75 Leaders, or a professional study that constitutes a
- 76 professional learning unit that requires multiple professional
- 77 learning experiences over time and is aligned with the Alabama
- 78 Standards for School Leadership, the Principal Leadership
- 79 framework, and the Alabama Standards for Professional
- 80 Learning.
- 81 (13) PROGRAM. The Alabama Principal Leadership
- 82 Development System created by this chapter.
- 83 (14) SCHOOL. A public school located in the state and
- providing instruction in grades preK-12, or any configuration



85	of	those	grades.

- 86 (15) SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR. Includes principals and
- 87 assistant principals.
- 88 (16) SUPERINTENDENT. The State Superintendent of
- 89 Education."
- 90 Section 2. This act shall become effective on June 1,
- 91 2025.
