13	Section 1. Section 45-3-84.40, Code of Alabama 1975, i
14	amended to read as follows:

16	(a) Commencing with the next term of office Beginning
17	October 1, 2025, in lieu of any other fees, compensation, or
18	expense allowances, the Judge of Probate of Barbour County
19	shall receive the an annual salary determined by the Barbour
20	County Commission, but in no event in an amount not less than
21	the minimum salary provided by general law for judges of
22	probate equal to 70 percent of the salary paid to a state
23	district court judge with equivalent years of service,
24	including any increases in salary due to years of service or
25	cost-of-living adjustments. The salary shall be paid in equal
26	monthly installments in the same manner as county employees
27	are paid.
28	(b) Commencing October 1, 1997, after ratification of

29	the proposed constitutional amendment relating to Barbour
30	County and the compensation of the judge or probate in the
31	current session of the Legislature, the judge or probate shall
32	receive a salary in the amount equal to the payment of all
33	fees, expenses, and compensation currently paid to the Judge
34	of Probate of Barbour County, not to exceed seventy-five
35	thousand dollars (\$75,000) per year. The annual salary shall
36	be paid in equal monthly installments in the same manner as
37	county employees are paid and shall be in lieu of any fees or
38	expense allowances. The salary of the judge of probate shall be
39	increased any time and in the same manner as the salary of a
40	state district court judge having the same number of
41	cumulative years of service.
42	(c) Commencing October 1, 1997, all fees, charges, and
43	compensation currently payable to the judge of probate shall
44	be paid into the county general fund and all expenses and
45	costs for the operation of the Office of the Judge of Probate
46	of Barbour County shall be paid by the county commission from
47	county funds The salary provided by this section shall be in
48	lieu of any and all other prior compensation or salary
49	provided by law to the judge of probate, and shall be paid in
50	equal periodic installments from the county general fund.
51	(d) In order to receive the compensation provided in
52	this section, the judge of probate shall waive any
53	compensation provided under Section 17-3-60, relating to
54	reports from the state voter registration list.
55	(e) The judge of probate shall be entitled to
56	reimbursement of expenses related to travel in the same manner
