12	tournament on the Coosa River unless evidence has been
13	provided that restocking attempts have been made and
14	have failed in the subject area.

(b) Notwithstanding Sections 9-2-7, 9-2-8, and 9-2-12, 29 30 Code of Alabama 1975, or any other law to the contrary, the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources may not 31 32 take any administrative action, including adoption of a rule, 33 that would prohibit the possession of a fish that measures a 34 certain length in a fishing tournament unless demonstrable 35 evidence has been provided that restocking attempts have been 36 made and have failed in the subject area.

37 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October38 1, 2025.
