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## 4 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the Director of

Transportation has the authority to acquire

rights-of-way to construct a state road, by purchase or

under the state, county, or municipal condemnation

This bill would authorize the appropriate governing body, upon petition from the land owner of the adjacent parcels, to deed the road back to the original land owner if the road has been abandoned and no longer used for the original purpose it was purchased due to unforeseeable circumstances rendering it unusable.

Relating to highways, roads, and bridges; to amend Section 23-1-45, Code of Alabama 1975; to allow a surrounding land owner to petition a governing body to deed abandoned, condemned property which was used to construct a state road back to the land owner when the road is no longer being used for the original purpose it was purchased and conditions have

- 30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 31 Section 1. Section 23-1-45, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 32 amended to read as follows:
- 33 "\$23-1-45
- (a) (1) Any other provision of law to the contrary
- 35 notwithstanding, the Director of Transportation shall have
- 36 authority to acquire the rights-of-way deemed necessary by the
- 37 State Department of Transportation for the construction of a
- 38 state road, either by purchase or by the exercise of the right
- 39 of eminent domain in condemnation proceedings as provided
- 40 under the laws of this state, or the county or municipality in
- 41 which such road deemed necessary by the Director of
- 42 Transportation is located shall acquire such rights-of-way
- deemed necessary by the Director of Transportation, when
- 44 requested to do so by said Director of Transportation.
- 45 (2) If Should the county or municipality fail or
- 46 refuse fails or refuses to acquire said rights-of-way, the
- 47 Director of Transportation shall have authority to may acquire
- 48 such rights-of-way as first above authorized in subdivision
- 49 (1). Rights-of-way acquired under the provision of pursuant to
- 50 this section shall be paid for in the manner prescribed by

- 52 (b) If at any point the road that was constructed on a
- 53 right-of-way at the direction of the Director of
- Transportation is abandoned, the property owner of the
- adjacent property that has the abandoned road running through
- his or her parcel may petition the governing state, county, or

59	governing body had acquired the right-of-way from the private

61	order to construct a road; (ii) the original owner or current
62	owner owns both sides of the road; and (iii) the constructed
63	road has been abandoned and no longer serves the original
64	purpose for which it was purchased due to certain
65	unforeseeable conditions rendering the road unusable."
