9	Relating to the Department of Archives and History; to
10	amend Sections 41-6-3 and 41-6-4, Code of Alabama 1975; to
11	further provide for the composition of the Board of Trustees
12	of the Department of Archives and History; to further provide
13	for the filling of vacancies on the board; and to provide for
14	retroactive effect.
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Sections 41-6-3 and 41-6-4, Code of Alabama
17	1975, are amended to read as follows:
18	<b>"</b> §41-6-3
19	(a) The department shall be under the control of the
20	Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives and History,
21	which shall consist of one member from each congressional
22	district—and the additional members selected pursuant to
23	subsection (b) as the districts existed on January 1, 2025,
24	nine at-large members, and the Governor or his or her
25	designee.
26	(b) Two additional at-large members shall be selected
27	and an additional member shall be selected from each U.S.
28	Congressional District. The additional members shall be



29	selected by the board of trustees and their names shall be
30	communicated to the Senate not later than the fifth
31	legislative day of the 2004 Regular Session of the
32	Legislature. Newly selected members shall be confirmed by the
33	Senate in the same manner as vacancies filled pursuant to
34	Section 41-6-4. The board of trustees shall select three of
35	the new members to serve initial terms of two years, three of
36	the new members to serve initial terms of four years, and
37	three of the new members to serve initial terms of six years.
38	All successor members shall serve terms of six years and shall
39	be selected as provided in Section 41-6-4.
40	(b) Each vacancy in an appointed board seat, as it
41	arises, whether by expiration of term of service or by death
42	or resignation, shall be filled as follows:
43	(1) Seat 1, a resident of Congressional District 1, for
44	a six-year term commencing January 1, 2027, and every six
45	years thereafter, appointed by the Governor.
46	(2) Seat 2, a resident of Congressional District 2, for
47	a six-year term commencing January 1, 2029, and every six
48	years thereafter, appointed by the Governor.
49	(3) Seat 3, a resident of Congressional District 3, for
50	a six-year term commencing January 1, 2030, and every six
51	years thereafter, appointed by the Governor.
52	(4) Seat 4, a resident of Congressional District 4, for
53	a six-year term commencing January 1, 2026, and every six
54	years thereafter, appointed by the Governor.
55	(5) Seat 5, a resident of Congressional District 5, for
56	a six-year term commencing January 1, 2028, and every six



- years thereafter, appointed by the Governor.

- a six-year term commencing January 1, 2028, and every six

- 72 (10) Seat 10, a resident of the state at-large, for a
- 73 six-year term commencing January 1, 2030, and every six years
- 74 thereafter, appointed by the Speaker of the House of

- 76 (11) Seat 11, a resident of the state at-large, for a
- 77 six-year term commencing January 1, 2027, and every six years
- 78 thereafter, appointed by the Speaker of the House of

	(c) The membership of the board of trustees appointing
autho	rities shall be coordinate their appointments to assure
that	the membership of the board is inclusive and shall
refle	ct_reflects_the racial_and, gender, geographic, urban,
rural	, and economic diversity of the state.
	(d) Each appointed member of the board shall serve at
the p	leasure of his or her appointing authority."

	(a) The board of trustees shall fill all vacancies
occur	ring on the board, whether by expiration of term of
<del>servi</del>	ce or by death or resignation, but the The names of all

112 <u>successor board members</u> shall be communicated to the current



session or the next ensuing regular session of the state

Senate for confirmation. If the Senate rejects any successor

trustee appointed member, the board appointing authority shall

proceed forthwith to fill the vacancy.

- member whose term has expired shall serve for a term of six years. A person An individual appointed to fill a vacancy occurring by death or resignation shall only serve out the unexpired term of his or her predecessor. A person whose appointment to the board has been confirmed by the Senate shall serve beyond his or her expired term until a successor has been confirmed by the Senate.
- 125 (c) The board shall hold at the State Capital at least 126 one regular meeting during every year and as many special 127 meetings as may be necessary, and at any meeting. a A majority of the trustees board members shall constitute a quorum. The 128 129 Governor of the state shall be a voting member of the board as 130 authorized by Section 41-6-3, and he or she shall, as far as 131 possible, shall lend every encouragement to the success and 132 upbuilding development of the department. The director shall 133 be the secretary of the board. The trustees Members of the 134 board shall receive no compensation for their services. Each 135 member of the board of trustees shall be reimbursed at the 136 same per diem and travel allowance amounts paid by law to 137 state employees for each day of attendance of the business of 138 the board.
  - (d) The board may do all of the following:
  - (1) Adopt rules for its own government and also for the

- 151 Section 2. This act shall be retroactive to January 1,
- 152 2025.
- 153 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately.
