4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would require persons engaging in the
6	business of cutting or uprooting aquatic plants in
7	public waters to employ certain methods to ensure cut
8	and uprooted plant matter is removed from these waters.
9	This bill would also provide criminal penalties
10	for violating this requirement.

17	Relating to state waters; to require persons engaging
18	in the business of cutting or uprooting aquatic plants in
19	public waters to use certain methods to remove this plant
20	matter; and to provide criminal penalties for violations.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. (a) Any person engaging in the business of
23	cutting, trimming, severing, or uprooting aquatic plants
24	within public waters, as defined in Section 9-11-80, Code of
25	Alabama 1975, shall employ commercially reasonable methods to
26	remove any cut, trimmed, severed, or uprooted aquatic plant
27	matter from public waters.
28	(b)(1) A person who violates this section shall be

29 guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and shall be fined not less 30 than five hundred dollars (\$500) to be remitted to the primary 31 enforcing law enforcement agency.

32 (c) The Department of Conservation and Natural 33 Resources shall adopt rules to implement and administer this 34 section, including establishing commercially reasonable 35 methods of removing, cutting, trimming, severing, or uprooting 36 aquatic plants.

37 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October38 1, 2025.
