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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Existing law provides that local emergency 6 management organizations, through the director, may 7 enter into mutual aid agreements with other public and 8 private agencies for reciprocal emergency aid when the 9 size of a disaster requires such aid.

10 This bill would transfer the authority to enter 11 into mutual aid agreements to the governing body of the 12 local emergency management organization; and would also 13 provide that mutual aid agreements can be developed 14 with other agencies for reciprocal aid to protect 15 public peace and safety.

16 This bill would also provide that employees of 17 other political subdivisions have the same power and 18 immunity when they render assistance under such a 19 mutual aid agreement outside their political 20 subdivision.

21 This bill would further make nonsubstantive 22 changes to update the existing code language to current 23 style.
