6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to public buildings; to provide requirements
10	for the installation and maintenance of powered,
11	height-adjustable, adult-size changing tables in public
12	bathrooms under certain circumstances; to provide grant award
13	payments to public entities with preexisting public
14	facilities; and to encourage the installation of adult-size
15	changing tables in private sector facilities.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the following
18	terms have the following meanings:
19	(1) PUBLIC BUILDING. A building or appurtenance to a
20	building designed for public access and maintained for the
21	public benefit through the use of state or local government
22	funds.
23	(2) PUBLIC ENTITY. Has the same meaning as defined in
24	42 U.S.C. § 12131.
25	(3) RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY. An organization, office, or
26	individual responsible for enforcing code requirements or
27	approving equipment, materials, installations, or procedures.
28	Section 2. (a) Beginning January 1, 2028, a public

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entity that constructs a new public restroom accessible to both men and women in a public building, or that totally renovates an existing public restroom that is accessible to both men and women in a public building, shall do all of the following:

34 (1) Ensure that one or more of the public restrooms has
35 a powered, height-adjustable, adult-size changing table that
36 is capable of serving both a baby and an adult.

37 (2) Provide signage indicating the location of the38 public restroom with the changing table.

39 (3) Revise any existing central directory or map 40 identifying the location of offices, restrooms, and other 41 facilities to indicate the location of the public restroom 42 with the changing table.

43 (4) Maintain, repair, and replace each changing table44 as necessary to ensure safety and ease of use.

45 (5) Clean each changing table with the same frequency46 as the public restrooms located within the facility.

47 (6) Provide sufficient clear floor space in the
48 installation of adult-size changing tables to comply with the
49 requirements of the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act
50 standards for accessible design prescribed in 28 C.F.R. §
51 35.151 and 36 C.F.R. Part 1191, appendices B and D.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), this section only applies to new construction and to a total renovation of a restroom for which a permit has been obtained, for which the cost of renovation is at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), and that totally removes all



nonstructural interior walls, floor and ceiling finishes, 57 58 mechanical systems, electrical systems, and plumbing fixtures 59 and supply and waste lines. If a public building operated by a 60 public entity is in compliance with the requirements of this section at the time of new construction or renovation, 61 62 additional changing tables are not required. 63 (c) The responsible authority may grant an exemption 64 from the requirements of this section if the responsible authority determines that any of the following apply: 65 (1) The installation would not be feasible. 66 67 (2) The installation would result in a failure to comply with the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act standards 68 for access for persons with disabilities. 69 70 (3) The installation would threaten or destroy the 71 historic significance of a historic property. (4) The public building is not frequented by the 72 73 public. 74 (d) This section does not establish a private right of 75 action. 76 (e) Beginning October 1, 2030, and every three years 77 thereafter, the amount provided in subsection (b) shall be 78 subject to a cost adjustment. The Chief Examiner of the 79 Department of Examiners of Public Accounts shall adjust the 80 amount provided in subsection (b) based on the percentage 81 increase in the Consumer Price Index for the immediately preceding three-year period, rounded to the nearest thousand 82 dollars. The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts shall 83 84 notify the public of the adjusted dollar amounts by July 1



85 before the fiscal year in which the change will take effect. 86 (e) Public K-12 schools and public institutions of 87 higher education are exempt from the requirements of this 88 section, unless the public K-12 school or public institution 89 of higher education has any area determined by the responsible 90 authority to be frequented by the public, including, but not 91 limited to, auditoriums, gymnasiums, stadiums, and sports 92 halls.

93 Section 3. (a) Subject to appropriation by the
94 Legislature, funds shall be appropriated to eligible public
95 entities for the installation of powered, height-adjustable,
96 adult-size changing tables in preexisting public restrooms.

97 (b) In awarding grants, the Legislature shall 98 prioritize geographical diversity and higher traffic 99 facilities. Applicants for grants must be public entities 100 located in this state. The award must be used for facilities 101 that are open to the public and accessible to both men and 102 women.

103 Section 4. The Legislature encourages the private 104 sector, when totally renovating building facilities and when 105 constructing new restrooms, to install and maintain powered, 106 height-adjustable, adult-size changing tables in restrooms 107 open to the public and accessible to both men and women. 108 Section 5. This act shall become effective on October 109 1, 2025.
