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- 4 Relating to employee benefits; to add Article 7 of

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 11 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as
- 12 the "Portable Benefits Act."
- 13 Section 2. Article 7, Chapter 1 of Title 25, starting
- 14 with Section 25-1-70, is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 \$25-1-70
- For purposes of this act, the following words have the
- 18 following meanings:
- 19 (1) BANK. A banking corporation or trust company
- 20 entitled to operate within the State of Alabama under Title 5
- of the Code of Alabama 1975.
- 22 (2) HIRING PARTY. A person or entity who hires or
- enters into a contract for the performance of work with an
- 24 independent contractor.
- 25 (3) PORTABLE BENEFIT ACCOUNT. An account opened by an
- 26 independent contractor that is:
- a. Administered by a portable benefit account provider;

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- b. Owned by an independent contractor for the purpose
- of funding the purchase of one of more benefit plans,
- 31 including, but not limited to, plans that provide health
- 32 benefits, income replacement insurance, life insurance, or

- 34 (4) PORTABLE BENEFIT ACCOUNT PROVIDER. The
- 35 administrator of a portable benefit account and includes:
- 36 a. A bank;
- 37 b. An investment management firm; and
- 38 c. A technology provider or program manager that offers
- 39 services through a bank or investment management firm.

- 41 (a) Any person or entity, including an Internet or
- 42 application based entity, may contribute funds to one or more
- 43 portable benefit accounts.
- (b) Where a hiring party contributes to a portable
- 45 benefit account as a form of compensation, the contribution
- 46 may not be construed by an Alabama court as any element of an
- 47 employment relationship, including, but not limited to, for
- 48 purposes of imposing liability on the hiring party under the
- 49 Alabama Workers' Compensation Act.
- 50 (c) A contribution to a portable benefit account may be

- (a) The following deductions may be made for tax years
- 66 beginning after December 31, 2025:
- (1) A hiring party that contributes its own funds to a
