

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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Relating to the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission; to amend Sections 41-9-430, 41-9-431, 41-9-432, 41-9-436, and 41-9-439, Code of Alabama 1975; to rename the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission as the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission; to provide that the Governor serve as an ex officio nonvoting member of the commission; to provide further for terms; to authorize interested public and private partners to provide facilities for U.S. Space and Rocket Center exhibits; to specify that the commission operates outside of the State Treasury; to provide further for the duties of the commission; to amend Sections 36-16-8 and 41-10-303, Code of Alabama 1975; to exempt historical artifacts held by the commission from the biannual personal property inventory audit conducted by the Property Inventory Control Division of the State Auditor's office; to authorize the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Finance Authority to rename the authority as the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Finance Authority; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing code language to current style.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:



Section 1. Sections 41-9-430, 41-9-431, 41-9-432, 29 30 41-9-436, and 41-9-439 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are 31 amended to read as follows: **"**§41-9-430 32 33 (a) (1) There is hereby created and established a state 34 agency to be known as the Alabama Space Science Exhibit 35 Commission, which shall be a public body corporate with all 36 the powers and privileges of a corporation, for the purpose of 37 providing for and participating in the management and control of facilities to house and display such visual exhibits of 38 39 space exploration and hardware used therefor as may be made 40 available by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. Such The facility shall constitute a permanent 41 42 housing for the national aeronautics and space administration 43 exhibit, which shall be open to the general public and shall 44 be located at a place to be designated and made available in 45 Madison County for a nominal cost through the cooperation of 46 the Department of the Army and other public and private 47 partners, where feasible, or at such other locations as the 48 commission may deem appropriate. 49 (2) a. Commencing on October 1, 2025, the name of the 50 Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission shall be the U.S. 51 Space and Rocket Center Commission, and all rights, duties, 52 property, real or personal, and all other effects existing in 53 the name of the Alabama Space Science Exhibit Commission, or 54 in any other name by which the commission has been known, shall continue in the name of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center 55 56 Commission. Any existing or future reference to the Alabama



Space Science Exhibit Commission, or any other name by which
the commission has been known, in any existing law, contract,
or other instrument, shall constitute a reference to the U.S.
Space and Rocket Center Commission.
b. A reasonable transition period for the name change
shall be allowed to permit an orderly and cost-effective
transition relating particularly to the use of equipment and
supplies. All letterhead, business cards, forms, and any other
materials in use by the commission containing the name Alabama
Space Science Exhibit Commission shall continue to be used by
the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission until the supplies
are exhausted. Replacement supplies shall contain the name of
the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission.
(3) The commission is further empowered to provide such
<pre>may do any of the following:</pre>
a. Provide facilities as will be mutually agreed upon
between the commission and the Department of the Army, or
other public and private partners, where feasible, for the
housing and display of army weaponry and mementos of national
defense.
b. The commission is further empowered to establish
<pre>Establish an energy information and exhibit center in order to</pre>
provide information to the public on research and development
in the field or energy as developed by the National
Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Department of the
Army, the Energy Research and Development Administration,
other federal and state agencies, including universities and
colleges, and other public and private sectors engaged in



85 energy related activities.

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c. The commission is further empowered to construct Construct or otherwise acquire, whether by purchase, construction, exchange, gift, lease, or otherwise, lodging and other similar facilities, including parking facilities and facilities for meetings, (provided said items are constructed within one mile of the Alabama Space and Rocket Center), for use by visitors to the permanent exhibit of the commission and users of the commission's visitors' center. In connection therewith, the commission may acquire any land or construct or acquire buildings or other improvements and all real and personal properties deemed necessary by the commission for such purpose, whether or not now in existence. The commission may lease to others any such facilities and may also lease lands of the commission on which such the facilities may be constructed and charge and collect rent therefor, and terminate any such lease upon the failure of the lessee to comply with any of the obligations thereof. The commission may also sell, exchange, or convey and grant options to any lessee to acquire any such facilities and may lease lands of the commission on which such the facilities may be constructed whenever the commission shall find any such action to be in furtherance of the purpose for which the commission was organized." "\$41-9-431 (a) The commission created by Section 41-9-430 shall consist of 18 members, to be appointed by the Governor, who

shall be bona fide residents and qualified voters of this



113	state, at least three of whom shall be residents of Madison
114	County. The remaining members of the commission shall be
	appointed from throughout the state in such manner as to
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116	provide general statewide representation on the commission,
117	<pre>but all Governor shall serve as an ex officio nonvoting member</pre>
118	of the commission whose absence does not affect a quorum. The
119	Governor shall coordinate his or her appointments to assure
120	the commission membership is inclusive and reflects the
121	racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic
122	diversity of the state. All members shall be qualified persons
123	individuals of unquestioned loyalty to this country who are
124	knowledgeable and interested in national defense and space
125	exploration and in the promotion of interest in such those
126	fields. Nine of the original members shall be appointed for
127	terms of four years, and nine of the original members shall be
128	appointed for terms of eight years. Thereafter Commencing on
129	October 1, 2025, as terms expire, all members shall serve for
130	terms of <pre>cight six</pre> years, with a limit of two full consecutive

 - (d) Members and employees of the commission shall be reimbursed for actual expenses incurred on behalf of the commission in the development, operation, promotion, and expansion of its commission programs and activities.
 - (e) The commission shall hold at least one annual meeting at the site of the exhibit, and one half one-half of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business which may properly come before the commission at any such meeting.
 - (f) The commission shall be authorized to may provide for an executive committee of not fewer than five of its commission members to whom it the commission may delegate such powers and authority as the commission may deem to be advisable."

- The commission shall be authorized may do all of the following:
 - (1) To investigate Investigate and select an available site for housing the exhibits, including the surrounding grounds, in cooperation with the Department of the Army and, the community, and other interested public or private



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partners, taking into consideration all pertinent factors
affecting the suitability of such the site;.

- (2) To acquire Acquire by rent or lease agreement or otherwise the necessary housing facilities and to establish, improve, and enlarge the available facility, including providing it the facility with necessary equipment, furnishings, landscaping, and related facilities, including parking areas and ramps, roadways, sewers, curbs, and gutters.
- agreements with the local, state, and federal governments, with agencies of such those governments, including the Department of the Army and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, with other public or private individuals, corporations, associations, and other organizations as the commission may deem necessary or convenient to carry out the purpose of this article, such contracts and agreements to include leases to private industry.
 - other sources as may be acceptable to the commission under such terms and conditions as may be provided by law and, in order to provide security for the repayment of any—such private loans, to pledge—such future revenues from admissions and any other sources as may from time to time be necessary or desirable.
- (5) To issue Issue and sell, subject to the approval of the Governor, interest-bearing general obligation bonds not in excess of \$1,900,000.00 one million nine hundred thousand



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dollars (\$1,900,000) in principal amount as authorized by constitutional amendment. Such The bonds shall be general obligations of the State of Alabama with full faith and credit and taxing power of the state to be pledged to the prompt and faithful payment of the principal of the bonds and the interest thereon. The proceeds from the sale of such the bonds shall be used exclusively for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred in the sale and issuance thereof and for the construction, establishment, improvement, or enlargement and equipment of building facilities and related grounds, including the renewal or replacement of structural parts of such the facility, but not including the purchase of the site for such the facility.

- (6) To issue Issue and sell at any time and from time to time its revenue bonds for the purpose of providing funds to acquire, enlarge, improve, equip, and maintain a facility and for the payment of obligations incurred for such those purposes. The principal and interest on any such revenue bonds shall be payable solely out of the revenues derived from the project.
- borrowing to issue and sell at any time and from time to time its revenue bonds (in addition to those authorized under subdivisions (5) and (6) hereof) for the purpose of carrying out the commission's power to construct or acquire lodging facilities, as set out in Section 41-9-430, the principal of and interest on which shall be payable solely out of the revenues and receipts derived by the commission from the



operation, leasing, or sale of the lodging facilities. The 225 226 resolution under which such the revenue bonds are authorized 227 to be issued and any mortgage and deed of trust or trust 228 indenture securing same may contain any agreements and 229 provisions respecting the operation, maintenance, and 230 insurance of the property covered by said the mortgage and 231 deed of trust or trust indenture, the use of the revenues and 232 receipts subject to such the mortgage and deed of trust or 233 trust indenture, the creation and maintenance of special funds from such the revenues and receipts, the rights, duties, and 234 235 remedies of the parties to any such instrument and the parties 236 for the benefit of whom such the instrument is made, and the 237 rights and remedies available in the event of default as the 238 commission shall deem advisable and which are not in conflict 239 herewith. Each pledge, agreement, mortgage, and deed of trust 240 or trust indenture made for the benefit or security of any of 241 such the revenue bonds of the commission shall continue 242 effective until the principal of and interest on the bonds for 243 the benefit of which the same were made shall have been fully 244 paid. In the event of default in such payment or in any 245 agreements of the commission made as a part of the contract 246 under which such the revenue bonds were issued, whether 247 contained in the proceedings authorizing those bonds or in any 248 mortgage and deed of trust or trust indenture executed as 249 security therefor, said the payment may be enforced by 250 mandamus, the appointment of a receiver, or either of said these remedies, and foreclosure of such the mortgage and deed 251 252 of trust or trust indenture may, if provided for in said



instrument, may be had;

- (8) To make such Make contracts in the issuance of its bonds as may seem necessary or desirable to assure their marketability and to provide for their retirement by a pledge of all or any revenue which may come to the commission from the investment of the proceeds of the sale of such the bonds or from any other source whatsoever.
- 260 (9) To accept Accept public or private gifts, grants.

- 262 (10) To acquire Acquire property by purchase, lease,
 263 gift, or license, such power not to include the purchase of a
 264 site for the facility;
 - (11) To allocate Allocate and expend funds from all donations, income, and revenue from any source whatsoever coming into its treasury for the fulfillment and accomplishment of its duties and responsibilities in such manner as may be necessary and appropriate for the perfection of the purposes of this article; The treasury of the commission is not within the State Treasury.
 - or donate any property, franchise, grant, easement, license, or lease or interest therein which it the commission may own and to transfer, assign, sell, mortgage, convey, or donate any right, title, or interest which it may have in any lease, contract, agreement, license, or property.
 - (13) To employ Employ a chief executive officer or an executive director and such additional personnel as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article. The

283	<pre>shall serve at the pleasure of the commission. The commission</pre>
284	shall fix the compensation of the chief executive officer or
285	executive director, and such additional personnel and such

287	commission. The commission shall designate the duties and
288	authority of the chief executive officer or executive director
289	and such additional personnel. The chief executive officer or
290	executive director and such any additional personnel shall not
291	be subject to the provisions of the state Merit System Act;
292	provided, however, that they shall be eligible for
293	participation, in whole or in part, in the state health
294	insurance plan and benefits as provided in Sections 36-29-1
295	through 36-29-12, and they shall be eligible for
296	participation, in whole or in part, in the State Employees'
297	Retirement System under the provisions of Section 36-27-6
298	governing counties, cities, towns $_{\underline{\prime}}$ and other quasi-public
299	organizations of the state; at the discretion of the
300	commission. The commission and the personnel of the commission
301	are not subject to the state calendar and other benefits
302	provided in Section 1-3-8, and may provide, by rule, for a
303	calendar, holiday schedule, and other employee benefits.
304	(14) To make such Adopt rules and regulations as the
305	commission may deem necessary and desirable to provide for the
306	operation, management, and control of the facility in
307	cooperation with the Department of the Army-and, with the
308	National Aeronautics and Space Administration+, and with other



public or private partners, where feasible.

(15) To expend Expend funds of the commission in the development, operation, promotion, and expansion of the programs and activities of the commission including the franchising, nationally and internationally, of the United States Space Camp, a youth science program developed and owned by the commission; and create, maintain, and operate additional education programs in rocketry, space exploration, astronomy, aviation, aeronautics, robotics, computer programming, cybersecurity, and any other topic the commission deems appropriate to fulfilling the educational mission and mandate of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center.

(16) To perform such Perform other acts necessary or incidental to the accomplishment of the purposes of this article, whether or not specifically authorized in this section, and not otherwise prohibited by law."

In view of the unique character and complexity of the duties and responsibilities imposed on the commission by this article, it is hereby specifically provided that the commission shall have, in addition to the power and authority enumerated in Section 41-9-432, the right, power and authority to commission may:

(1) Develop and institute a program of promotion and advertising of the exhibits and facilities provided for by this article, said. The program of promotion and advertising to shall be conducted by the commission both within and without the state in such manner and to such extent as may be



deemed economically advisable and appropriate by the commission:

- property on a competitive bid basis in the manner prescribed by law for the purchase of such items by state trade schools, state junior colleges and state colleges and universities under the supervision and control of the State Board of Education, the city and county boards of education, the district boards of education of independent school districts, the county commissions and the governing bodies of the municipalities of the state and the governing boards of instrumentalities of counties and municipalities under Sections 41-16-50, 41-16-51 and 41-16-53 through 41-16-63.

 Procure supplies and services in the same manner as an educational or eleemosynary institution governed by a board of trustees or other similar governing body pursuant to Section 41-4-124(b)(1); and
- (3) Operate itself or, in its discretion enter into lease agreement with a person or agency of its choosing to operate, all concessions located in or on the grounds and facilities operated by the commission, any such lease agreement to be so designated as to provide maximum services and convenience to the patrons of the exhibit center and to provide reasonable revenue return to the commission."

The provisions of this article shall be construed liberally, it being the purpose to provide in this state appropriate housing facilities for displaying to the general



public exhibits of the Department of the Army and of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, in cooperation with public and private partners, if feasible, and for providing for the management and control of that portion of the display furnished and supplied by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration by such means as may be feasible and agreed upon."

372 Section 2. Sections 36-16-8 and 41-10-303 of the Code 373 of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

"\$36-16-8

The Property Inventory Control Division shall establish a control in the following manner of all nonconsumable state personal property not exempt under Section 36-16-11.

shall designate one of its employees as property manager for the department or agency. Except for books, the property manager shall make a full and complete inventory of all nonconsumable personal property and certain other items of personal property deemed important or sensitive enough by the Property Inventory Control Division to be included in the inventory of state property of the value of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more owned by the state and used or acquired by the department or agency. The inventory shall show the complete description, manufacturer's serial number, cost price, date of purchase, location, and custodial agency, responsible officer, or employee, and the state property control marking. A copy of the inventory shall be submitted to the Property Inventory Control Division on October 1 and April



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1 of each year. Each inventory shall show all property acquired since the date of the last inventory. When any inventory fails to show any property shown on the previous inventory, then a complete explanation accounting for the property or the disposition thereof shall be attached to the inventory and submitted to the Property Inventory Control Division. All property managers shall keep at all times in their files a copy of all inventories submitted to the Property Inventory Control Division, and the copies shall be subject to examination by any and all state auditors or employees of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts.

- (2) Each property manager shall be the custodian of, and responsible for, all property in his or her department or agency. When any property is entrusted to other employees or officers of the department or agency, the property manager shall require a written receipt of the property so entrusted, which receipt shall be executed by the person receiving the property. In that event, the property manager shall be relieved of responsibility of the property, and the employee or officer of the department or agency shall be responsible for the property.
- the Department of Archives and History under Section 41-6-10,
 shall be disposed of, transferred, assigned, or entrusted to
 any other department, agency, or employee thereof without the
 written permission of the Director of the Alabama Department
 of Economic and Community Affairs or the Governor of the State
 of Alabama or the designee of either of them.

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- (4) Biannually, the Property Inventory Control Division shall conduct an inventory of all—such state personal property excluding historical materials in the custody of the Department of Archives and History and historical materials in the custody of the U.S. Space and Rocket Center Commission, holding every officer or employee strictly accountable for all personal property assigned to his or her custody.
- (5) No later than November 30 of each new fiscal year, the State Auditor shall report in writing to the Governor all losses and missing items of state property valued at more than five hundred dollars (\$500) as revealed by the most recent inventory of state personal property.
- (6) Whenever any property manager ceases for any reason to be the property manager of his or her department or agency, the director of the department or agency shall immediately notify in writing the Property Inventory Control Division. The division shall immediately check the inventories of all property in the department or agency, and the successor to the property manager shall execute a written receipt for all property received by him or her or coming into his or her custody or control. The last payment of salary due the property manager shall be withheld until a complete check of the inventory of the property has been made and approved. In the event of any shortages, the property manager shall be held strictly accountable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the property manager shall not be held accountable for property entrusted to any other employee or officer of the department or agency and for which he or she holds the written receipt of



the employee or officer."

- (a) To become a corporation, the three individuals selected pursuant to Section 41-10-302—hereof shall present to the Secretary of State of Alabama an application signed by them which shall set forth:
 - (1) The name and residence of each of the applicants, together with a certified copy of all documents evidencing each applicant's selection by the commission and approval by the Governor;
- (2) The name of the proposed corporation, which shall initially be the "Alabama Space Science Exhibit Finance Authority" and, upon proper application filed by the commission with the Secretary of State, shall be renamed the "U.S. Space and Rocket Center Finance Authority";
- (3) The location of the principal office of the proposed corporation; and
- (4) Any other matter relating to the incorporation of the proposed corporation which the applicants may choose to insert and which is not inconsistent with this article.
- (b) The application shall be subscribed and sworn to by each of the applicants before an officer authorized by the laws of this state to take acknowledgements to deeds. The Secretary of State shall examine the application, and if he or she finds that it the application substantially complies with the requirements of this section, he or she shall receive and file it the application and record it in an appropriate book of records in his or her office."
