15	WHEREAS, China repeatedly exerts economic coercion,

17	UN Resolution 2758 (XXVI) excluding Taiwan's participation

19	challenges to rules-based international order and aggressive
20	authoritarian expansionism; and
21	WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' eighth-largest
22	trading partner, and the United States is Taiwan's
23	second-largest trading partner, with an estimated \$128
24	billion worth of trade, and Taiwan is Alabama's 13th largest
