7	WHEREAS, Hurricane Helene made landfall as a Category
8	4 Hurricane on September 26, 2024; it was the deadliest
9	Atlantic Hurricane since Hurricane Maria in 2017 and the
10	deadliest to strike the mainland United States since
11	Hurricane Katrina in 2005; and
12	WHEREAS, Helene moved quickly inland and degenerated
13	to a post-tropical cyclone where it stalled over east
14	Tennessee and west North Carolina, causing catastrophic
15	flooding and landslides and spawning eight tornadoes in the
16	state; and
17	WHEREAS, North Carolina continues to need assistance
18	with its clean-up and rebuilding efforts; the State of
19	Alabama sent relief personnel in 2024, but we can give
20	further assistance today; and
21	WHEREAS, Sylvan Springs landfill is capable of
22	assisting by accepting excess debris from North Carolina;
23	the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, FEMA, and state and local
24	agencies involved in the contracting for debris removal may
25	use railroad cargo or any other means to transport the
26	debris to Alabama's landfills, specifically the Sylvan
27	Springs landfill; now therefore,
