4 SJR____ COMMENDING THE INTERNATIONAL FERTILIZER DEVELOPMENT
5 CENTER ON ITS 50TH ANNIVERSARY.

7 WHEREAS, highest commendations are extended to the 8 International Fertilizer Development Center (IFDC) in Muscle 9 Shoals, Alabama, on celebrating its 50th Anniversary of 10 groundbreaking contributions to global agricultural 11 sustainability; and

12 WHEREAS, IFDC was founded in 1974 in response to a 13 global food crisis, with nearly 500 million people lacking 14 sufficient food; prompted by U.S. Secretary of State Henry 15 Kissinger's call for improved agricultural production in developing countries, IFDC was established with funding from 16 17 Canada's International Development Research Centre and the 18 U.S. Agency for International Development, and land from 19 Tennessee Valley Authority in Muscle Shoals; initially operating out of temporary facilities, IFDC has since 20 21 expanded its reach, establishing offices in Africa, Asia, 22 and Europe and working to enhance agricultural sustainability in nearly 100 nations; and 23

24 WHEREAS, over the past 50 years, IFDC has trained 25 millions of smallholder farmers in sustainable soil 26 practices to enhance their livelihoods and ensure the 27 resilience of future food systems; IFDC's efforts are 28 crucial for fostering sustainable and equitable agricultural



29 practices worldwide; and

30 WHEREAS, headquartered in Alabama, IFDC leads global 31 agricultural innovation to improve soil health, crop 32 productivity, and food security; its Alabama pilot plant and 33 research labs develop and test fertilizers ensuring efficient and scalable solutions for farmers; with over 500 34 35 employees worldwide, including 60 in Alabama, IFDC continues 36 to advance sustainable agriculture and support international 37 farming communities; and

38 WHEREAS, as IFDC marks its 50th Anniversary, its 39 legacy highlights the need for ongoing investment in 40 agricultural research to address global population 41 challenges; with a solid base in Alabama and expanding 42 influence in Africa and Asia, IFDC is poised to advance its 43 mission of enhancing soil health and agricultural 44 productivity; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the International Fertilizer Development Center is honored and commended on the occasion of celebrating its 50th Anniversary, and by copy of this resolution for appropriate presentation and display, we convey our highest tribute along with heartiest congratulations and best wishes for the future.
