1 2 3 4 SJR MOURNING THE DEATH OF JUDGE DAVID JOE BRELAND. 5 WHEREAS, with an overwhelming sense of loss, we mourn 6 7 the death, yet celebrate the life, of Judge David Joe 8 Breland of Decatur, Alabama, whose passing on April 30, 9 2025, at the age of 72, has left a void in the lives of his 10 loving family and friends and the entire community, where he was highly regarded; and 11 WHEREAS, born on March 16, 1953, in Decatur, Alabama, 12 13 to the late Judge Edwin DeWitt Breland, Sr. and Hazel Dykes Breland, Judge Breland embodied a lifelong commitment to 14 faith, family, and public service; and 15 WHEREAS, a 1971 graduate of Decatur High School and a 16 proud alumnus of The University of Alabama, Judge Breland 17 began his legal career by joining his father's law practice 18 19 before being appointed Morgan County District Judge in 1983 by Governor George Wallace, a position he would hold with 20 21 distinction for 25 years, being re-elected four times 22 without opposition; and WHEREAS, Judge Breland was a visionary in juvenile 23 24 justice reform, establishing community-based services that 25 became a statewide model that influenced the Alabama Juvenile Justice Act of 2008, while also serving as a 26 trusted advisor and statewide coordinator in juvenile 27 justice initiatives; and 28

29 WHEREAS, after retiring from the bench, Judge Breland 30 continued his service as Director of Historic Resources for 31 the City of Decatur, where he oversaw major restoration 32 projects, including the Old State Bank and the Historic 33 Union Depot, preserving Decatur's history and promoting 34 civic pride until his retirement in 2025; and

35 WHEREAS, his many accolades include the Barrett C. 36 Shelton Sr. Freedom Award, Paul Harris Fellow, Silver Beaver 37 and Whitney Young Awards from the Boy Scouts of America, and 38 induction into the Morgan County Schools Foundation 39 Leadership Hall of Fame, in addition to his service on the 40 Alabama Historical Commission and leadership roles in Rotary 41 Club and Decatur-Morgan Hospital; and

42 WHEREAS, above all else, Judge Breland was a devout 43 Christian, devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend, 44 known for his compassion, wisdom, and quiet strength, 45 leaving behind a legacy of justice, dignity, and leadership 46 that will long be remembered and honored; and

WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents andhis sister, Carolyn Lee Breland; and

WHEREAS, left to cherish his memory are his wife of 45 years, Drama Dorning Breland; son, Will (Brooke); daughter, Mary Katherine (Michael); nephew, Jordan Phillips (Grace); niece, Julia Tichenor (Adam); brother, Edwin DeWitt Breland, Jr. (Virginia); and beloved grandchildren, Grady Phillips, Mira Breland, Spencer Breland, James Tichenor, and Mary Stephen Phillips (Stevie); and
