## W11V3EE-1 02/25/2025 KMS EBO KMS 2025-966 SUB HB166 EDUCATION POLICY SUBSTITUTE TO HB166 OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE DUBOSE



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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, a local board of education 6 may permit a pupil to carry or use a pocket pager, 7 cellular telephone, or other electronic communication 8 device while on school property.

9 This bill would establish the Freeing our 10 Classrooms of Unnecessary Screens for Safety (FOCUS) 11 Act to prohibit a student from using, operating, or 12 possessing a wireless communications device on public 13 elementary or secondary school grounds during the 14 instructional day, subject to certain exceptions and 15 subject to written policies adopted by a local board 16 of education.

17 This bill would require each local board of 18 education to adopt an Internet safety policy that 19 addresses student access to the Internet on 20 district-owned devices.

This bill would also require students to receive instruction on the risks and benefits of social media and how to use social media safely before admission to the eighth grade.

44	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
45	Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares the
46	following:
47	(1) Each student in an Alabama public K-12 school should
48	be college-ready or career-ready upon high school graduation.
49	(2) Many high school teachers believe that cell phones
50	and other electronic communication devices are distracting
51	students in the classroom.
52	(3) Studies have shown that cell phones and other
53	electronic communication devices are negatively impacting
54	learning outcomes.



55 (4) Studies have shown that increased social media usage 56 may negatively affect the mental health of school-aged 57 children.

58 Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following 59 terms have the following meanings:

(1) INSTRUCTIONAL DAY. The period of time during which a
public elementary or secondary school is open and in session
for purpose of meeting the minimum number of instructional
days or hours pursuant to Section 16-13-231, Code of Alabama
1975. The term also includes class transitions, lunch,
non-instructional times, and any other time specified in a
wireless communication device policy.

(2) WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE. A cellular telephone,
tablet computer, laptop computer, pager, gaming device, or any
other portable electronic device identified in a wireless
communication device policy that has the capability of
exchanging voice, messaging, or other data communication with
another electronic device.

(3) WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE POLICY. A written
policy adopted by a local board of education to implement this
act.

Section 3. (a) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, no student shall use or operate any wireless communication device in any public elementary or secondary school building or on the grounds thereof during the instructional day.

80 (b) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, no student
81 may possess a wireless communication device in any public
82 elementary or secondary school building or on the grounds

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83 thereof during the instructional day unless the wireless 84 communication device is turned off and stored off their person 85 in a locker, car, or similar storage location.

86 (c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), a student 87 may use, operate, or possess a wireless communication device 88 in a public elementary or secondary school building or on the 89 grounds thereof during the instructional day in any of the 90 following circumstances:

91 (1) The use, operation, or possession is pursuant to the 92 student's Individualized Education Program, Individualized 93 Accommodation Plan, Section 504 plan, or Individualized Health 94 Plan.

95 (2) The use, operation, or possession is for educational
96 or learning purposes under the supervision of local board of
97 education personnel.

98 (3) The use, operation, or possession occurs during an
99 emergency threatening the life or safety of the student or
100 another person.

(d) No later than July 1, 2025, each local board of
education shall adopt a wireless communication device policy.
The wireless communication device policy shall include
consequences for violations. The local board of education
shall reasonably distribute the wireless communication device
policy to students, parents, faculty, staff, and the State
Board of Education.

Section 4. (a) No later than July 1, 2025, each local board of education shall adopt an Internet safety policy that



110 addresses student access to the Internet on devices owned by 111 the local board of education.

(b) The policy shall do all of the following:
(1) Limit Internet access by students to only
age-appropriate subject matters and materials deemed
age-appropriate pursuant to the policy.

(2) Protect the safety and security of students when using email, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communication.

(3) Prohibit access by students to unlawfully obtained data or information, including hacking, and other unlawful online activity by students.

(4) Prohibit access to websites, web applications, or software that exposes students to the disclosure, use, or dissemination of their personal information.

(5) Prohibit students from accessing social media
platforms, except when expressly directed by a teacher solely
for educational purposes.

(c) The principal shall be responsible for ensuringconsistent compliance with the policy by school personnel.

Section 5. (a) Each certificated staff member employed by the local board education shall complete an annual written anonymous survey regarding the implementation of the wireless communication device policy and to measure uniform compliance within the school.

(b) On or before October 1, 2025, the State Department of
Education shall develop a survey to assess the levels of
participation and compliance with the wireless communication



device policy. On or before June 1, each subsequent year, the annual survey results shall be submitted by the principal to the local superintendent of education, local board of education, and the State Board of Education for publication on the website of the State Department of Education.

(c) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, failure of a school to meet the minimum standards of uniform compliance with the wireless communication device policy or this act shall result in a deduction of 30 percent of the common purchase allocation for the school.

148 Section 6. Section 16-40-13 is added to the Code of 149 Alabama to read as follows:

150 \$16-40-13

(a) No later than July 1, 2025, the State Department of
Education shall develop and approve an asynchronous, digitally
delivered course that addresses the risks of using social
media and how to use social media safely.

155 (b) At a minimum, the course shall include the following 156 topics:

(1) The benefits of safely using age-appropriate social
media platforms, including career and resume building for
future academic or employment opportunities; sharing
information with family and friends; and safely connecting
with other users with similar interests.

162 (2) The risks of social media use including its negative
163 effects on mental health, including addiction; the
164 distribution of misinformation on social media; how social



165 media manipulates behavior; and the permanency of sharing 166 materials online.

(3) Safe practices for using social media including how to report suspicious behavior; how to identify cyberbullying, phishing and scam communications, predatory behavior, and human trafficking; and maintaining personal security and preventing oversharing of personal information.

(c) The State Department of Education shall make the 172 course available online and each local board of education 173 shall reasonably notify parents of its availability. Each 174 175 local board of education shall deliver the course to all students prior to entering the eighth grade and shall make the 176 course available to students in grades eight through 12 who 177 transfer to the school district or who otherwise have not 178 completed the course. 179

180 (d) The State Board of Education may adopt rules to181 implement this section.

Section 7. Section 16-1-27, Code of Alabama 1975, providing for the use of electronic communications devices on school property, is repealed.

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Section 8. This act shall become effective immediately.
