



## FISCAL NOTE

### House Bill 271

**House Bill 271** as passed the House of Representatives would authorize the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to issue new disabled resident lifetime hunting, freshwater fishing, and saltwater fishing licenses with \$30 fees for residents over the age of 50 years old, and \$50 fees for those under the age of 50. This bill also provides that these fees may be adjusted periodically based on the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI), as currently provided by law for certain other hunting and fishing licenses.

This bill would increase receipts to the Alabama Game and Fish Endowment Fund and Marine Resources Endowment Fund, while correspondingly decreasing receipts to the Game and Fish Fund and the Marine Resources Fund, by undetermined amounts dependent upon the number of disabled resident lifetime licenses purchased that would otherwise have been purchased annually, as provided below:

Freshwater fishing, 50 years old or older	2,157	\$3.45	\$30
Freshwater fishing, less than 50 years old	503	\$3.45	\$50
Hunting, 50 years old or older	1,213	\$7.35	\$30
Hunting, less than 50 years old	256	\$7.35	\$50
Saltwater fishing, 50 years old or older	859	\$3.45	\$30
Saltwater fishing, less than 50 years old	205	\$3.45	\$50

Finally, this bill would allow the department to assess an issuance fee of \$1 for each license, which would also be subject to the periodic CPI adjustment. Current law provides that this fee may be retained by the judge of probate, issuing officer, or other authorized license agent.
