House Bill 268 as introduced would increase the obligations of the Alabama 911 Board, paid from the 911 Fund, by an undetermined amount dependent on the cost to: (1) establish a system to measure readiness of public safety services; (2) conduct audits and provide remediation plans for certain local 911 districts; and (3) assume operational control of certain 911 districts to implement remediation. The increased obligations incurred by the Board, while implementing a remediation plan, could be offset, in whole or in part, by requesting reimbursement from the local government entity that created the district, per the provisions of this bill.

In addition, the bill could increase the administrative obligations of the Office of the Attorney General to comply with the provisions of this bill.
