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SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, the Alabama Board of
Cosmetology and Barbering is responsible for licensing
and regulating cosmetologists, barbers, estheticians,
manicurists, and other practitioners of beauty culture.

This bill would provide for the licensing and regulation of makeup artists and the permitting of lash/brow artists by the board.

This bill would provide for certain exemptions and would authorize the operation of mobile studios.

This bill would also specify qualifications for licensing and would provide qualifications for grandfathering.

TO BE ENTITLED

Relating to the Alabama Board of Cosmetology and Barbering; to amend Sections 34-7B-1, 34-7B-13, and 34-7B-30, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide further for definitions; to provide further for exemptions; to authorize the operation of mobile studios; to add Section 34-7B-25.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for the qualifications, licensing,

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- 29 and grandfathering of makeup artists; and to add Section
- 30 34-7B-25.2 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for the
- 31 qualifications and permitting of lash/brow artists.
- 32 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 33 Section 1. Sections 34-7B-1, 34-7B-13, and 34-7B-30 of
- 34 the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
- 35 "\$34-7B-1
- For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms
- 37 **shall** have the following meanings:
- 38 (1) APPRENTICE. Any person individual engaged in
- 39 learning the practices defined in this article including, but
- 40 not limited to, assisting in the performance of any acts of
- 41 barbering or cosmetology on the general public under the
- 42 constant and direct supervision of a person an individual who
- 43 has held a valid current license issued by the board for at
- least five two years, in a shop or studio licensed by the
- 45 board.
- 46 (2) BARBERING. The occupation of shaving or trimming
- 47 the beard, cutting or dressing the hair, giving facial or
- 48 scalp massages, giving facial or scalp treatment with oils or
- 49 creams or other preparations made for that purpose, either by
- 50 hand or by means of mechanical appliances, singeing and
- 51 shampooing the hair, dyeing the hair, or permanently waving or
- 52 straightening the hair of any living or deceased person
- individual for compensation, as performed by a Class 2 barber.
- 54 (3) BOARD. The Alabama Board of Cosmetology and
- 55 Barbering.
- 56 (4) CLASS 1 BARBER. A person An individual who only



- 57 does the following in his or her ordinary course of business:
- 58 Arranges, cleans, cuts, or singes the hair of any person
- 59 individual or massages, cleans, stimulates, exercises, or does
- 60 similar work on the scalp, face, or neck of any person
- 61 individual with the hands, or with mechanical or electrical
- apparatus or appliance, or by the use of cosmetic
- preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams. Any one
- or a combination of the following practices, when done upon
- 65 the human body above the seventh cervical vertebra for
- 66 cosmetic purposes and not for the treatment of disease or
- 67 physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment,
- directly or indirectly or without payment for the public
- 69 generally: Shaving or trimming the beard or trimming the hair.
- 70 (5) CLASS 2 BARBER. Any person individual, other than a
- 71 student or apprentice, who performs barbering on the general
- 72 public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
- 73 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
- 74 chapter article for a Class 2 barber. For the purposes of this
- 75 chapter article, the term barber, standing alone, shall be
- deemed a reference to a Class 2 barber.
- 77 (6) COSMETOLOGIST. Any person individual, other than a
- 78 student or apprentice, who performs cosmetology on the general
- 79 public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
- 80 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
- 81 article for a cosmetologist.
- 82 (7) COSMETOLOGY. Any of the practices generally
- 83 recognized as beauty culture, hairdressing, or any other
- 84 designation engaged in by any person individual who performs



such on the general public for compensation including, but not limited to, cleansing, singeing, cutting, arranging, dressing, curling, braiding, waxing, bleaching, weaving, coloring the hair by hand or mechanical apparatus, the use of creams, lotions, or cosmetic preparations, with or without massage, on the scalp, face, arms, legs, feet, or hands, esthetics practices, nail technology, manicure, pedicure, or

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- (8) ESTHETICIAN. Any person individual, other than a student or apprentice, who performs esthetics on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this article for an esthetician.
- 98 (9) (10) ESTHETICS. The practice of performing acts of
 99 skin care including, but not limited to, facials, body waxing,
 100 makeup application, and general esthetics procedures on the
 101 general public for compensation.
- 102 $\frac{(10)}{(11)}$ ESTHETICS/MANICURE. A combination of the 103 practices of esthetics and manicure.
- (11) (9) ESTHETICIAN/MANICURIST. Any person individual,
 other than a student or apprentice, who performs a combination
 of the practices of esthetics and manicure on the general
 public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
 article for an esthetician/manicurist.
- 110 (12) INSTRUCTOR. A licensee who teaches in a licensed 111 or registered school of barbering or any branch of cosmetology 112 and completes any applicable requirements for continuing

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| 114 | (13) LASH/BROW APPLICATION. The practice of performing |
| 115 | temporary, semi-permanent lash application services including, |
| 116 | but not limited to, strip lashes, cluster lashes, individual |
| 117 | and single lashes, lash extensions, brow tint, brow |
| 118 | laminations, brow wax, brow arch, brow extensions, brow |
| 119 | threading, and lash lift. The term does not include |
| 120 | microblading, microshading, or microfeathering. |

| 136 | limited to, manual makeup applications, airbrush application, |

(21)(25) SCHOOL. An establishment licensed or registered by the board to teach any or all of the practices of barbering or cosmetology.

(22) (26) SHAMPOO ASSISTANT. Any person individual who is licensed to perform only the practices of shampooing, cleansing, or applying temporary weekly color rinses to the hair of the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this article for a shampoo assistant.

(23) (27) SHOP. Any place where barbering or cosmetology is practiced including, but not limited to, a mobile salon.

Only a properly licensed person individual, who is not an apprentice or a student, may operate a shop.

(24) (28) STUDENT. Any person individual who is engaged in learning any practice regulated by this article in a school licensed or registered pursuant to this article, and who, as part of the learning process, performs or assists in any practice regulated by this article under the immediate supervision of an instructor who is licensed pursuant to this article.

(29) STUDIO. Any place where makeup, brow, lash, or other esthetics services are practiced including, but not limited to, a mobile studio or salon. Only a properly licensed individual, who is not an apprentice or student, may operate a

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- 198 $\frac{(25)}{(31)}$ THREADING. The practice of eyebrow removal with the use of a loop made of cotton or any other material.
- 200 (26) (30) THREADER. Any person individual engaged in the
 201 practice of threading on the general public for compensation,
 202 and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure
 203 requirements provided in this article for a threader."

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This chapter does not apply to any of the following individuals, persons, activities, or services:

- (1) Service in the case of emergency or domestic upheaval, without compensation.
- 209 (2) Licensed medical professionals operating within the 210 scope of their normal practice.
- 211 (3) Personnel of the United States—<u>armed services</u> <u>Armed</u>
 212 Services performing their ordinary duties.
 - (4) Any public trade school or other public school or school program under the purview of the State Board of Education or a local board of education.
 - (5) Any person individual who only occasionally dresses hair and receives no compensation therefor, or does any other act or thing mentioned in this chapter, without holding himself or herself out to the public as a provider of any practices defined in this chapter article for compensation.
 - (6) Departments in retail establishments where cosmetics are demonstrated and offered for sale but where no other acts of cosmetology or barbering are performed.
 - (7) The licensees of any county or municipal barber

 - (1) Is at least 16 years of age.

- 260 (3) Has successfully completed one, or a combination of, the following:
- a. At least 300 clock hours of makeup application
 instruction in a school licensed or registered under this
 article or on courses reported in credit hours. Credit hour
 programs shall be reviewed and approved by the board as
 satisfying licensure requirements.
- b. At least 600 hours in a shop or studio, over a

 period of two years and not exceeding eight hours a day or 48

 hours a week, under the immediate supervision of a makeup

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- (b) Any applicant for a lash/brow permit who satisfies the qualifications in subsection (a), registers with the board, pays any applicable examination fee, successfully completes any required examination, and pays an original license fee shall be issued a lash/brow artist permit. Any individual permitted as a lash/brow artist pursuant to this section shall be subject to this article and rules adopted by the board including, but not limited to, shop or studio requirements, sanitation procedures, and permit renewal.
- 324 (c) Any individual who, on August 1, 2026, has been 325 professionally engaging in lash/brow application for at least 326 two years and who submits proof satisfactory to the board of 327 the following: (i) maintaining a professional website for at 328 least two years; (ii) maintaining insurance coverage of a type 329 and in an amount required by board rule; (iii) completing a 330 16-hour course approved and administered by the board or a 331 third-party provider approved by the board; and (iv) 332 demonstrating proficiency pursuant to a skills examination 333 administered by the board, upon payment of the applicable license fee by January 1, 2027, shall be issued a permit by 334 the board as a lash/brow artist under this section. 335
