
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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, a water well contractor is
6	required to be licensed by the Alabama Department of
7	Environmental Management.
8	This bill would further provide for an
9	unrestricted well driller's license and for a
LO	restricted license for engaging in drilling specific
L1	wells or pump installation, repair, and related
L2	activity.
13	This bill would increase the fee for licensure
L 4	and provide for a two-year licensure period.
L 5	This bill would further require continuing
L 6	education of licensees.
L 7	This bill would also authorize the Environmenta
L 8	Management Commission to adopt rules to implement this
L 9	act, including fees for filing water well completion

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27	Relating to the Alabama Department of Environmental

Relating to the Alabama Department of Environmental Management and well driller licenses; to amend Sections

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- 29 22-24-1, 22-24-2, 22-24-3, 22-24-4, 22-24-5, 22-24-7, 22-24-8,
- 30 and 22-24-11 of the Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide
- 31 for the licensing of well drillers and other persons doing
- 32 related activity; to increase the fees for licensure and
- provide a two-year licensure period; to require continuing
- 34 education of licensees; and to authorize the Environmental
- 35 Management Commission to adopt rules.
- 36 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 37 Section 1. Sections 22-24-1, 22-24-2, 22-24-3, 22-24-4,
- 38 22-24-5, 22-24-7, 22-24-8, and 22-24-11 of the Code of Alabama
- 39 1975, are amended to read as follows:
- 40 "\$22-24-1
- For the purpose of this chapter, the following terms
- 42 shall have the following meanings respectively ascribed to
- 43 them by this section:
- 44 (1) BOARD. The Alabama Department of Environmental
- 45 Management. CATHODIC PROTECTION WELL. An excavation drilled
- 46 for the purpose of installing equipment or a system for the
- 47 electrical protection of metallic structures from corrosion.
- 48 (2) DIRECTOR. The Director of the Alabama Department of
- 49 Environmental Management. COMMISSION. The Environmental
- 50 Management Commission.
- 51 (3) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama Department of Environmental
- Management.
- 53 $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ DRILL. To $\frac{\text{drill or}}{\text{drill}}$ redrill, bore, auger, dig, or
- 54 otherwise construct a water well.
- $\frac{(4)}{(5)}$ DRILLER. Any person who manages or supervises
- 56 the drilling of a water well.





57 (6) GEOTHERMAL WELL. An excavation drilled for the 58 purpose of obtaining or exchanging geothermal energy for use with geothermal air conditioning or heat pump systems. 59 60 (5) (7) LOG. A record of the type of material or rock penetrated in the drilling of a water well. 61 62 (8) MONITORING WELL. An excavation drilled for the 63 purpose of locating and sampling for engineering or geological 64 data. 65 (6) (9) PERSON. Any individual, organization, group, association, partnership, corporation, or any combination of 66 67 them other business entity operating a business to drill water 68 wells. 69 (10) PUMP. All machinery, parts, and fittings installed 70 on or attached to a well. 71 (11) RELATED ACTIVITY. Any activity reasonably related to drilling, maintaining, or repairing a well or pump, 72 73 including grouting, plugging, abandoning, and decommissioning 74 a well or borehole. 75 (7) (12) SAMPLE. Cuttings or other fragments of rock or 76 soil materials removed from the a well. 77 (8) (13) WATER WELL. A hole An excavation drilled for 78 the production of water. 79 (14) WELL. A water well, monitoring well, geothermal 80 well, or cathodic protection well." 81 "\$22-24-2 82 (a) It is the intent of the Legislature that this chapter applies solely to wells drilled for the production of 83 84 water and water wells, monitoring wells, geothermal wells, and

85	cathodic protection wells; pump installation, maintenance, and
86	repair; and any related activity.
87	(b) This chapter has no application to wells or holes
88	drilled, augered, cored $\underline{}$ or dug for quarry blast holes or
89	mineral prospecting or any purpose other than water

92	(a) The board is authorized and directed to make,
93	<pre>promulgate and publish such commission shall adopt rules</pre>
94	pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter
95	22 of Title 41, and regulations as it deems reasonable and
96	necessary to effectuate and carry out the purpose and
97	provisions of this chapter, and a true copy of such rules and
98	regulations shall be kept on file with the Secretary of State
99	and copies thereof shall be made available for public
100	distribution.
101	(b) Prior to any rule change being proposed by the
102	commission, the department shall consult with the Alabama
103	Ground Water Association and other affected parties, as

111	It shall be unlawful for any No person to operate any
112	equipment or machinery in the drilling may drill or repair of



113 a water well, monitoring well, geothermal well, or cathodic 114 protection well; install, maintain, or repair a pump; or perform any related activity unless the overall operation is, 115 116 at all times, performed by or under the supervision—and 117 management of a person licensed water well driller as provided for in pursuant to this chapter." 118 "\$22-24-5 119 Every person who intends to drill water wells within 120 the State of Alabama shall annually obtain from the board a 121 water well driller's license and, in order to obtain said 122 license, shall file with the board, in accordance with rules 123 124 and regulations as established by the board, an application 125 form, to be made available by the board. Any person, upon filing said application and receiving approval of the board, 126 127 shall pay an annual fee of \$200.00 to the board, and the payment of said fee shall entitle said person to the full and 128 129 complete privileges of drilling water wells, as provided in 130 this chapter, and the board shall issue a license for a period not to exceed one year. Said annual fee paid to the board 131 132 shall not exempt a person from additional state or county 133 privilege taxes.(a) A person who manages or supervises the 134 drilling or repair of a water well, monitoring well, 135 geothermal well, or cathodic protection well; installs, maintains, or repairs a pump; or performs any related activity 136 137 shall be licensed under this chapter. 138 (b) The department shall issue two types of licenses as 139 follows: 140 (1) An Unrestricted Well Driller's License. A license





141 that authorizes a person to engage in the business of: (i) 142 drilling and repairing water wells, monitoring wells, geothermal wells, and cathodic protection wells; (ii) 143 144 installing, maintaining, and repairing pumps; and (iii) any 145 related activity. (2) A Restricted License. A license that authorizes a 146 147 person to engage in only one or more of the following 148 activities as specified in the conditions of the license: 149 a. Drilling and repair of a specific type of well. b. Installation, maintenance, and repair of pumps and 150 151 any related activity. 152 (c) A license may be issued to an individual or to a 153 business entity. A license may only be issued to a business entity if a principal employee who is individually licensed is 154 155 listed on the business' license. (d) Commencing October 1, 2026, all licenses issued by 156 157 the department shall be valid for a two-year license period. 158 (e) (1) The department shall charge a fee to issue a 159 license as follows: 160 a. An unrestricted license fee shall be one thousand 161 dollars (\$1,000). 162 b. A restricted license fee shall be five hundred 163 dollars (\$500). (2) An additional fee of five hundred dollars (\$500) 164 165 shall be charged for the issuance of a business license. 166 (f) A license shall be renewed on October 1 and shall be delinquent if not paid by December 31 of each renewal 167

period. Any renewal that is delinquent may be renewed by the

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169 payment of an additional delinquency fee of twenty dollars 170 (\$20) per month of delinquency, for up to one year. 171 (g) An applicant for an initial individual license 172 shall be subject to examination and shall satisfy all 173 requirements as provided by rule of the commission. The 174 license fee for a new licensee shall be prorated on a monthly 175 basis for the balance of the license period. 176 (h)(1) Commencing on the renewal of each license for 177 the license period beginning on October 1, 2028, each individual licensee shall submit proof of completing eight 178 179 hours of continuing education approved by the department according to license type to renew a license. 180 181 (2) A licensee who fails to submit proof of completing the required continuing education shall be given a grace 182 183 period to complete the continuing education until March 31 after the commencement of the new license period." 184 185 "\$22-24-7 186 (a) A license may be refused or The department may refuse to issue a license, -a suspend or revoke an issued 187 license duly issued may be suspended or revoked, or the refuse 188 189 to renew a license renewal thereof refused by the board, if, 190 after notice and hearing as provided in this section, it the department finds that the applicant for, or holder of, such a 191 192 license: 193 (1) Is unable to present evidence of his or her 194 qualifications suitable to the board department; (2) Has intentionally made a material misstatement in 195 196 the application for such a license;

- 199 (4) Has obtained, or attempted to obtain, <u>such</u> a
 200 license by fraud or misrepresentation;
- 201 (5) Has been guilty of fraudulent or dishonest 202 practices; or
- 203 (6) Has demonstrated lack of competence as a driller of water wells.
- 205 (b) Before any license shall be is refused, or 206 suspended, or revoked, or the renewal thereof of a license is refused, under this section, the board department shall give 207 notice of its intention to do so by registered or certified 208 209 mail to the applicant for, or holder of, such a license and 210 shall set a date not less than 20 days from the date of 211 mailing such the notice when the applicant or licensee may 212 appear to be heard and produce evidence. 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(c) No licensee whose license has been revoked under this section shall be entitled to file another application for a license as a water well driller under this chapter within one year from the effective date of such the revocation or, if judicial review of such the revocation is sought, within one year from the date of final court order or judgment affirming such the revocation. Such The application, when filed, may be refused by the board department unless the applicant shows good cause why revocation of his or her license shall not be deemed a bar to the issuance of a new license."

- 237 It shall be unlawful and a violation of this chapter to
 238 drill a water well within the State of Alabama unless the
 239 following provisions are complied with: (a) A licensee shall do
 240 all of the following while performing an activity for which a
 241 license is required by this chapter:
- 242 (1) The driller of the water well shall be licensed as provided in Section 22-24-5.
- 244 (2) (1) The driller shall, at At all times during the
 245 drilling of a water well, keep posted in a conspicuous
 246 location, at or near the well being drilled or on his person,
 247 the appropriate license certificate as furnished on the
 248 drilling equipment a current sticker issued by the department
 249 indicating licensure by the board.
- 250 (3) (2) Before the commencement of the drilling
 251 operation starting the construction of a water well, the
 252 driller shall file an application of intent to drill a water



253 well, as directed by the board department.

(4) (3) The driller of the well, within Within 30 days after completion of completing the drilling of each a water well, shall deliver to the board department a water well completion certification form, upon forms to be supplied by the board, a "report of well drilled.". The board department shall notify the local health authorities within seven days of the receipt thereof receiving the certification for potable and agricultural water wells only.

(5) (4) The driller shall furnish Furnish a log and a set of samples to the State Geological Survey from wells specifically designated by the board department or State Geologist. The samples shall be collected during the drilling at intervals of not more than 10 feet.

(b) The commission, by rule, may adopt a schedule of fees due for the filing of a water well completion certification form pursuant to subdivision (a)(3). A fee may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and shall be in an amount according to whether the water well is used for an industrial, commercial, or domestic purpose or other criteria as determined by rule of the commission. The fee for a single-family residence or duplex may not exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250). The fees may be paid electronically. All fees shall be deposited into the Environmental Management Fund and used for the administration of this chapter and shall not revert to the State General Fund at the end of each fiscal year."

281	Any person guilty of violating any of the provisions of
282	who violates this chapter or any rule adopted pursuant to this
283	chapter or the rules and regulations adopted thereunder shall
284	be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine of
285	not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each
286	violation. Each day the violation continues shall be
287	considered a separate violation. Any and all funds derived
288	from such fines shall be deposited with the State Treasurer in
289	the Alabama Department of Environmental Management Fund_is
290	subject to Section 22-22A-5 of the Alabama Environmental
291	Management Act."
292	Section 2. All rules of the Alabama Department of
293	Environmental Management in Division 9 of Title 335 of the
294	Alabama Administrative Code shall continue as rules of the
295	Environmental Management Commission until amended or repealed.
296	Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
297	1, 2026.
