WHEREAS, it is with profound sadness that we note the death of Ronnie Dell Joiner of Rockford, Alabama, on February 2, 2026, at the age of 71; and

WHEREAS, he will be remembered as a devoted husband, loving father, and proud grandfather; Ronnie demonstrated an unwavering commitment to faith, family, country, and community; and

WHEREAS, Ronnie was born in Tallapoosa County, and lived a life defined by hard work and service; he proudly served in the United States Army Reserves and Alabama National Guard for 34 years, including his deployment during Operation Enduring Freedom in Iraq; throughout his military career, he earned numerous medals and honors and retired with distinction as a First Sergeant; and

WHEREAS, for more than 50 years, Ronnie built an impressive career in construction and home building, earning a reputation for craftsmanship, integrity, and dedication; and

WHEREAS, his life was marked by selfless service to others; he was a founding member of the Kellyton Town Council, served on the Town of Rockford Water and Gas Board, was a member of Rockford Masonic Lodge #137, served on the

29 Rockford Cemetery Board, and held the position of Vice
30 President of the Coosa County Historical Society; he was
31 also a proud member of the Executive Committee of the Coosa
32 County Republican Party and the Veterans of Foreign Wars;

34 WHEREAS, Ronnie served eight years as Coosa County
35 Commissioner for District 4, during which time he played a
36 vital role in establishing the county's first-ever
37 countywide ambulance service and extending water services to
38 the Richville community, efforts that continue to benefit
39 countless families; and

40 WHEREAS, he worked tirelessly throughout his life and
41 believed deeply in earning everything through honest labor;
42 known for his strong work ethic and selfless heart, he was
43 always willing to help anyone in need, whether through his
44 craftsmanship, leadership, or quiet acts of kindness; and

45 WHEREAS, Ronnie had a deep appreciation for the past
46 and often shared stories and knowledge with those around
47 him; he participated in historical reenactments and could
48 frequently be found restoring older homes, preserving log
49 cabins, or admiring unique finds while antiquing with his
50 wife; his love of history was matched only by his love of
51 family and community; and

53 O'Dell Joiner; sister, Janelle Dillard; and brother, Benny
