7 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®
8 (AKA), an international service organization, is the oldest
9 Greek-letter organization established by African American
10 college-educated women; it was founded on the campus of
11 Howard University in Washington, D.C., on January 15, 1908;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, the nine young charter members-Ethel
14 Hedgemon Lyle, Anna Easter Brown, Beulah Elizabeth Burke,
15 Lillie E. Burke, Marjorie Hill, Margaret Flagg Holmes,
16 Lavinia Norman, Lucy Diggs Slowe, and Marie Woolfolk
17 Taylor-founded AKA on five original core tenets: to
18 cultivate and encourage high scholastic and ethical
19 standards; to promote unity and friendship among college
20 women; to study and help alleviate problems concerning girls
21 and women in order to improve their social stature; to
22 maintain a progressive interest in college life; and to be
23 of "Service to All Mankind"; and

24 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®,
25 was successfully incorporated on January 29, 1913; and

26 WHEREAS, since its founding in 1908, AKA membership
27 has grown to include more than 390,000 initiated members in
28 more than 1,105 graduate and undergraduate chapters located

29 in 14 nations and territories; and

30 WHEREAS, AKA is dedicated to implementing programs of
31 service that enhance the well-being of local, national, and
32 international communities; and

33 WHEREAS, led by International President and Chief
34 Executive Officer Danette Anthony Reed of Dallas, Texas, AKA
35 is often hailed as "America's premier Greek-letter
36 organization for African American women"; and

37 WHEREAS, under Danette Anthony Reed's leadership, six
38 initiatives designed to improve the lives of those they
39 serve have been implemented: "Strengthen Our Sisterhood"
40 serves as the Foundation Initiative, strengthening the bonds
41 within the sorority to support the service mission; the
42 remaining five initiatives serve as Program Initiatives,
43 which include: "Empower Our Families," "Build Our Economic
44 Wealth," "Enhance Our Environment," "Advocate for Social
45 Justice," and "Uplift Our Communities"; and

46 WHEREAS, these initiatives are designed to improve
47 lives by working collaboratively to maximize outreach on
48 progressive endeavors and to consistently produce leaders
49 who will advance the credo of service; and

50 WHEREAS, this legislative body recognizes the
51 importance of partnering with civic and community-based
52 organizations whose advocacy strengthens democratic
53 engagement and public policy; and

54 WHEREAS, today we welcome the sisters of Alpha Kappa
55 Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®, and Dr. Tracey Morant Adams,
56 who serves as the South Eastern Regional Director, a region

57 which includes Alabama, Tennessee, and Mississippi, and
58 encompasses 122 undergraduate and graduate chapters with
59 over 14,000 active members committed to the mission and
60 legacy of this illustrious and transformative organization;

63 continued dialogue and partnership between Alabama lawmakers
64 and the South Eastern Region of AKA, to work collaboratively
65 to address issues impacting families and communities,
66 including voting rights, economic empowerment, maternal

69 commitment to advancing strategic legislation, elevating
70 community priorities, and developing action-oriented
71 solutions that promote equity, service, and sustained civic
