SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, individuals who are retired under the Employees' Retirement System are authorized to work in certain capacities and at certain levels of compensation without suspension of his or her retirement allowance.

This bill would authorize any individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was classified as either a law enforcement officer or a state policeman prior to retirement to perform duties as a sheriff's deputy or municipal police officer without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided the compensation earned does not exceed \$52,000 per year.

This bill would also authorize any individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System and is licensed to practice law in this state to perform duties as an assistant district attorney without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided the compensation earned does not exceed \$52,000 per year.

37	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
38	Section 1. Section 36-27-8.2, as last amended by Act
39	2025-409, 2025 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, is
40	amended to read as follows:
41	" §36-27-8.2
42	(a) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
43	Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity,
44	including as an independent contractor, with any employer
45	participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the
46	Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her
47	retirement allowance provided that: (i) the individual is not
48	employed in a permanent full-time capacity; and (ii) the
49	individual's compensation from the employer in calendar year
50	2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000).
51	Beginning in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year
52	thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the
53	same percentage increase as the increase in the Consumer Price
54	Index for all urban consumers as published by the U.S.
55	Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase
56	in the annual earning limit shall be rounded to the next



lowest multiple of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any
amount in excess of the one thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple
considered in determining the increase for the following year.

Each adjustment shall be based on the increase in the index
for the preceding 12-month period ending on September 30 and
the increase shall be effective for the following calendar
year.

- (b) Any individual serving as an elected official who has retired from the Employees' Retirement System may serve for his or her full compensation in an elected public office with the state, a county, or an incorporated municipality without suspension of retirement benefits; provided, that under no circumstances shall such an individual participate in or accrue additional benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System for that service, and provided that under no circumstances shall an individual whose retirement is based upon service as an elected official continue in or return to the office and receive both pension benefits and salary. Any provision of this subsection to the contrary notwithstanding, a retiree serving as a local elected superintendent of education shall not receive both pension benefits and salary unless his or her compensation as a local elected superintendent of education does not exceed the annual earning limits provided in subsection (a).
- (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree performing duties under this section shall certify to the employer any information required in order to carry out this

The retiree shall provide written notice of the 86 postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after 87 88 the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will 89 be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will 90 earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under 91 this section. 92 (d) (1) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement 93 System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' Standards 94 95 and Training certification, and was classified as either a law enforcement officer, as defined in Section 36-27-59, or a 96 97 state policeman, as defined in Section 36-27-1, prior to 98 retirement, may perform duties as any of the following a 99 school resource officer, as defined in Section 16-1-44.1, a correctional officer with the Department of Corrections, or a 100 police officer at any state college or university pursuant to 101 102 Section 16-22-1 without suspension of his or her retirement 103 allowance, provided that the compensation earned does not 104 exceed fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year:

- 105 <u>a. A school resource officer, as defined in Section</u> 106 16-1-44.1.
- b. A correctional officer with the Department ofCorrections.
- 109 <u>c. A police officer at any state college or university</u> 110 <u>pursuant to Section 16-22-1.</u>
- d. A sheriff's deputy.
- e. A municipal police officer.

- (2) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers'
 Standards and Training certification, and meets any all of the following criteria may perform duties as a correctional officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided that the compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year:
- a. Was classified as a law enforcement officer, as

 defined in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement Is retired

 under the Employees' Retirement System.
- b. Was classified as a state policeman, as defined in
 Section 36-27-1, prior to retirement Has the applicable Alabama
 Peace Officers' Standards and Training Certification.
- 128 c. Was classified as a correctional officer, as defined 129 in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement, and retired pursuant 130 to Section 36-27-16(a)(1)c.
- 131 (3) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' 132 Retirement System, who has both the applicable Alabama 133 Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission 134 certification and the applicable State Board of Health 135 certification as a firefighter and an emergency medical 136 services personnel, as defined in Section 36-27-59, prior to 137 retirement, may perform duties as a firemedic without 138 suspension of his or her retirement allowance provided that the compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand 139 140 dollars (\$52,000) per year, commensurate with the work

142	(4) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
