4 Relating to civil procedure; to render unenforceable  
5 any provision of an agreement that prohibits an individual or  
6 entity from disclosing certain acts of sexual abuse or facts  
7 related to certain acts of sexual abuse.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9                   Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as  
10          Trey's Law.

11                   Section 2. The Legislature finds and declares all of  
12   the following:

13 (1) Sexual abuse causes significant and lasting harm to  
14 individuals and society as a whole.

15 (2) Sexual abuse survivors often experience long-term  
16 physical, psychological, and emotional trauma.

20 (4) Any agreement that prohibits an individual or  
21 entity from disclosing an act of sexual abuse or facts related  
22 to an act of sexual abuse is against the public policy of this  
23 state.



29        criminal violation of Articles 4, 4A, 4B, 6, 6A, 8, or 11 of  
30        Chapter 6 of Title 13A, Code of Alabama 1975, or any of the  
31        offenses listed in Section 15-20A-5, Code of Alabama 1975,  
32        regardless of whether the conduct has led to a criminal  
33        charge, conviction, adjudication, or sentence.

34                (b) (1) Any provision of a nondisclosure agreement,  
35        confidentiality agreement, employment agreement, settlement  
36        agreement, or any other type of agreement that prohibits an  
37        individual or entity from disclosing an act of sexual abuse or  
38        facts related to an act of sexual abuse to another individual  
39        or entity is void and unenforceable.

40                (2) This subsection shall apply to any agreement  
41        entered into, executed, or amended on or after October 1,  
42        2026, and shall apply solely to elements of an agreement  
43        related to the act of sexual abuse and shall not apply to  
44        other aspects of an agreement, including, but not limited to,  
45        compensation.

46                Section 4. This act shall become effective on October  
47        1, 2026.
