added by Act 2025-385 of the 2025 Regular Session, is

26 "§28-12-45

27 (a) Other than pharmacies selling topical or
28 sublingual consumable hemp products pursuant to
29 subsection (b) and retail food stores selling beverage
30 consumable hemp products pursuant to subsection (c), all
31 retailer establishments must be restricted so that only
32 those individuals 21 years of age or older are permitted
33 to enter and the establishment has its own dedicated
34 public entrance. Except as provided in subsection (b) and
35 (c), the board shall only issue retailer licenses to
36 persons:

37 (1) That have a valid retail liquor license from the
38 board which authorizes off-premises consumption only;

39 (2) That have a valid permit from the board to
40 operate as a specialty retailer of electronic nicotine
41 delivery systems pursuant to Section 28-11-7.1; or

42 ~~(2)~~ (3) That only sell consumable hemp products.

43 (b) Topical and sublingual consumable hemp products
44 may be sold in a pharmacy licensed by the Alabama State
45 Board of Pharmacy, provided the pharmacy obtains a
46 consumable hemp product retailer license from the
47 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and complies with this
48 chapter and rules of the board. Any topical consumable



49 hemp product sold in a pharmacy must be sold by a
50 licensed pharmacist or by a pharmacy technician or
51 employee who is under the direct supervision and control
52 of a licensed pharmacist. This subsection does not
53 prohibit a retailer described in subsection (a) from
54 selling topical or sublingual consumable hemp products in
55 that retailer's licensed premises.

56 (c)(1) Consumable hemp products that are beverages
57 may be sold in a retail food store, provided the retail
58 food store obtains a consumable hemp product retailer
59 license from the board and complies with this chapter and
60 rules of the board. Consumable hemp product beverages
61 sold in a retail food store must be kept in an area that
62 is: (i) separated from nonalcoholic beverages or
63 beverages intended for children; (ii) behind glass; and
64 (iii) demarcated by a sign indicating that the beverages
65 contain hemp-derived compounds. This subsection does not
66 prohibit a retailer described in subsection (a) from
67 selling consumable hemp product beverages in that
68 retailer's licensed premises.

69 (2) For purposes of this subsection, "retail food
70 store" means any store commonly known as a supermarket,
71 food store, or grocery store, primarily engaged in the
72 retail sale of a variety of canned goods, frozen foods,



73 nonalcoholic beverages, dry goods, either packaged or in
74 bulk, and fresh produce or meats, and the store
75 dedicates: (i) a minimum of 75 percent of the store's
76 selling area to the sale of food items listed in this
77 subdivision; and (ii) at least 14,000 square feet of the
78 store's footprint to the sale of food items listed in
79 this subdivision.

80 (d)(1) A retailer described in subsection (a) shall
81 maintain at its licensed premises a minimum of 500 square
82 feet of sales and service area. A retailer may not
83 include in the calculation of sales and service area any
84 areas that are not open to customers or not used for
85 sales or displaying consumable hemp products, such as
86 office space or storage.

87 (2) A retailer must have an employee present in the
88 sales and service area of the licensed premises at all
89 times the premises is open to customers.

90 (3) The purchase of all consumable hemp products must
91 take place in the licensed premises.

92 (e) A retailer shall display the retailer license in
93 the licensed premises in a conspicuous manner."
