EXAMINER'S SUMMARY

**City of Midfield Emergency Communications District
Jefferson County, Alabama
October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022**

This report presents the results of an examination of the Emergency Communications District (hereinafter referred to as the "District") and a review of the District's compliance with applicable laws and regulations of the State of Alabama in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts under the authority of the *Code of Alabama 1975*, Section 41-5A-12 and the *Code of Alabama 1975*, Section 11-98-6(e).

The Agency Overview contained in this report provides information on the District's operating authority. The District's financial information for the examination period is contained in Exhibit 1.

RESULTS OF THE EXAMINATION

An instance of noncompliance with state and local laws and regulations and other matters was found during the examination as shown on the Schedule of State and Local Compliance and Other Findings and it is summarized below.

FINDING

- ◆ 2022-001: The District failed to reconcile bank accounts and maintain an accurate cashbook in which all receipts and disbursements were recorded.

EXIT CONFERENCE

Board members, as reflected on Exhibit 2, were invited to an exit conference to discuss the results of this examination. The City of Midfield Emergency Communications District (hereinafter referred to as the “District”) was established pursuant to the *Code of Alabama 1975*, Section 11-98-2, and is responsible for providing emergency communication services in the City of Midfield. This includes the operation and administration of duties for which they were elected or appointed, which includes, but is not limited to: (1) To establish, operate, maintain, and replace an emergency communication system; (2) To establish a common addressing and location identification program; and (3) To establish the emergency service number data base to facilitate efficient operation of the system.

2022-001	<p><u>Finding:</u></p> <p>Pursuant to the <i>Code of Alabama 1975</i>, Section 11-98-5.2, a statewide 911 fund was created to account for all revenues derived from the service charge levied on voice communications service providers and the distribution of these funds. The <i>Code of Alabama 1975</i>, Section 11-98-6, requires the local emergency communication district to be responsible for the administration of the funds received from the distributions of the statewide 911 fund. The adequate administration of these funds requires appropriate policies and procedures to be established to ensure a cashbook is maintained in which all receipts and disbursements are recorded and the balance of funds on hand is properly reflected. In addition, monthly bank reconciliations should be performed to detect and correct errors on the bank statements or those that may occur in the cashbook. Tests performed during the examination indicated that bank reconciliations were not performed and a cashbook was not properly maintained that reflected all receipts, disbursements and the cash balance for all accounts. Policies and procedures were not in place to ensure bank reconciliations were performed or a cashbook was properly maintained. Therefore, the City of Midfield Emergency Communications District failed to comply with the <i>Code of Alabama 1975</i>, Section 11-98-5.2 and Section 11-98-6, which require the local emergency communication district to be responsible for the administration of their funds.</p> <p><u>Recommendation:</u></p> <p>All receipts and disbursements should be accurately recorded in the cashbook. These transactions should be posted to the cashbook on a timely basis and the balance should be reconciled with the bank account monthly.</p>
