Family Assistance (TANF)


- Program Statistics:
 - TANF cases: 5,673
 - Recipients: 12,881
 - o 1996 = Over 48,000 recipients
 - Children: **10,484**
 - Children only in budget: 59%
 - Average monthly payment per case: \$192.12
 - JOBS Program: 2,372 adult clients required to participate; 1,468 are employed (62%)







Child Support

- Program Statistics:
 - Families served: 182,325
 - FY 2023 collections: \$357 million
 - Paternity establishment rate: 98.81%

 15th consecutive year we have exceeded 90% (federal requirement)

Most benefits are distributed via card





Child Care Services

- Administers the state's child care subsidy program, which pays for child care for low-income working families
- Approximately 41,000 children receive child care subsidies each month
- Subsidies averaged **\$524** per child, per month in FY 2023
- \$262 million was paid to child care providers in FY 2023 for child care slots
- DHR licenses and inspects child care providers



Child Care Services

- Child Care Facilities
 - Licensed centers: 1,326
 - Licensed child care homes: 565
 - Exempt child care facilities: 472
- Federal ARPA Funds Awarded in FY 2023:
 - Child Care Stabilization Grants \$220,897,125
 - Child Care Workforce Bonuses \$109,011,000
- Alabama Quality STARS (QRIS) is part of a national systematic approach to assess, improve, and communicate the level of quality in early care and education programs. There are currently 1,930 participating providers.
- QRIS Incentive Bonuses Awarded in FY 2023 \$21,163,850





Adult Protective Services

Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation Reports

- Investigates reports of abuse, neglect, and exploitation of vulnerable adults
- DHR provides protective services for vulnerable adults who may be victims of abuse, neglect, and/or exploitation




Child Welfare

 DHR provides for the investigation and prevention of abuse, neglect, and/or exploitation of children in Alabama






Children in CANs & Preventions




Children in CANS Children in Preventions Total




Children in CPS Cases










Children in Care (5,906 children)






Entry to Care Reasons by Child's Age (FY23)




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Entries & Exits From Care



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
Greatest Challenges

- Over 61% turnover rate of Child Welfare Direct Workers
- Placements
 - Children & Youth with Mental Health Needs
 - Juvenile Delinquency Issues
- Lawsuits
- Social Media
- Outdated Computer Systems: SNAP, TANF, Child Care

Staffing Levels By Fiscal Year



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
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Challenges to Hiring and Retention

- 1. Often cannot compete with wages paid by other employers
- 2. In child welfare:
 - Hours required (night & weekend time calls and field work)
 Nature of the job (entering homes; handling emergencies; threats)
 - Lack of placements for certain youth
- 3. Often encounter dangerous and traumatic situations
- 4. Many other entities competing for same staff now
 - More pay and predictable work environment with no field or after hours work
- 5. Social media
- 6. Lawsuits (including a Federal Class Action)

DHR By the Numbers – FY 2023

- 776,000* Alabamians fed per month (18,000 applications ineligible) 12,325 Elderly and vulnerable adults were protected
- 718,000* Children received summer meals ۲
- **10,484** Children received TANF benefits
- **2,372** Adults participated in JOBS work program ۲
- **182,325** Child Support cases
- **\$357 million*** in Child Support collections
- **38,000*** Cases in court for routine legal matters
- **41,000*** Children of low-income parents received child care
- **\$262 million*** Paid to support families in need of child care ۲
- **\$351+ million** Paid to providers to support child care industry
- **4,273** Licensing/inspection visits to child care providers

- **52,000+** Children involved in reports of Child Abuse/Neglect
- **5,923** Children protected and cared for in Foster Care
- **7,453** Children protected and cared for in their own homes
- **2,000+** Foster Homes for children approved/inspected
- 47,327 Central Registry checks
- **26,195** Criminal History checks
- **4,533** SNAP recipients in Employment & Training programs
- **1,700** Participants in Fatherhood programs
- **700** Individuals received assistance for domestic violence
