



FINANCE AND TAXATION GENERAL FUND SUBSTITUTE TO SB66
OFFERED BY SENATOR ALBRITTON

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SYNOPSIS:

This bill makes supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024: from the Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services in the amount of \$2,243,062; and from the State General Fund to various executive, legislative, and judicial agencies and entities of the state for a total amount of \$210,827,369.

A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

To make supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024: from the Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services in the amount of \$2,243,062; and from the State General Fund to various executive, legislative, and judicial agencies and entities of the state for a total amount of \$210,827,369.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated



29 \$2,243,062 from the Youth Services Reimbursement Fund for
30 Diversion Programs to the Department of Youth Services for the
31 fiscal year ending September 30, 2024.

32 Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations
33 heretofore and hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
34 total of \$210,827,369 from the State General Fund to the
35 following executive, legislative, and judicial agencies and
36 entities of the state for the purposes specified below for the
37 fiscal year ending September 30, 2024:

38 (1) To the Legislative Services Agency, \$500,000. This
39 appropriation shall be used to contract with an outside entity
40 to conduct a comprehensive review of Alabama's current
41 policies and procedures governing state employment to identify
42 recommendations that may be taken to incorporate a modernized
43 approach to recruiting, retaining, compensating, and
44 supervising qualified candidates for state employment. The
45 agency shall file a report by January 1, 2025, with the
46 Governor and the Chairs of the Senate Committee on Finance and
47 Taxation - General Fund and the House Ways and Means - General
48 Fund Committee with the results and recommendations of the
49 study.

50 (2) To the Legislative Council for construction of a
51 parking deck related to the new State House construction,
52 \$20,000,000.

53 (3) To the Supreme Court for one-time repairs and
54 maintenance of the Heflin-Tolbert building and IT hardware
55 upgrades, \$716,600.

56 (4) To the Department of Commerce to be used for the



57 for pier repairs for the Alabama State Port Authority,
58 \$5,000,000.

59 (5) To the Department of Corrections - Correctional
60 Capital Improvement Fund established in Section 14-2-21(c),
61 Code of Alabama 1975, for prison construction, \$150,000,000.

62 (6) To the Emergency Management Agency to replace the
63 Mobile Command vehicle, \$600,000.

64 (7) To the Department of Finance for the State Capitol,
65 \$3,005,769. Of this amount, \$1,511,494 shall be used for
66 building security upgrades, and \$1,494,275 shall be used for
67 repairs to include recoating exterior walls and structural
68 floors.

69 (8) To the Geological Survey for the Core and Sample
70 Repository, \$3,500,000.

71 (9) To the State Industrial Development Authority for
72 site development, \$15,000,000. The fund shall be managed and
73 controlled by the State Industrial Development Authority and
74 expended to provide grants for the assessment of and
75 subsequent development of sites.

76 (10) To the State Law Enforcement Agency for in-car
77 cameras, body cameras, and handheld radios, or other related
78 expenses, \$4,833,000.

79 (11) To the Department of Mental Health to keep the
80 psychiatric beds operational at Bullock County Hospital while
81 the hospital converts to the CMS Rural Emergency Hospital
82 model, \$1,000,000.

83 (12) To the Department of Senior Services for the
84 Medicaid Waiver Program, \$1,672,000.



85 (13) To the Department of Veterans' Affairs,
86 \$5,000,000. Of this amount, \$2,500,000 shall be used for the
87 construction of Dovetail Landing to help veterans transition
88 to civilian life; and \$2,500,000 shall be used for Veterans
89 Recovery Resources in Mobile.

90 Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately.
