- 38 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 39 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution
- 40 of Alabama of 2022, is proposed:
- PROPOSED AMENDMENT
- Part 1. Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of
- 43 2022 is repealed and in lieu thereof the following language
- 44 shall be adopted as Section 65:
- 45 Section 65
- 46 (a) Except as expressly provided in this constitution,
- 47 the Legislature shall have no power to authorize any form of
- 48 gaming activity for any purpose and shall pass laws to
- 49 prohibit and effectively eradicate any unlawful gaming
- 50 activity and unlawful gaming-related activity.
- 51 (b) The Legislature, by general law, may authorize and
- 52 provide for the following gaming activities:
- 53 (1) An official state lottery, administered by a public
- 54 corporation established by general law, using only tickets
- 55 made of cardboard, paper, plastic, or some functionally
- 56 similar material unless otherwise required to participate in a



57 multi-jurisdiction lottery.

- 58 (2) Casino-style games played only in person on the 59 premises of a licensed gaming establishment.
- 60 (3) Sports wagering conducted only on events that have not yet occurred or are already underway.
- 62 (4) Traditional raffles only if registered with the commission.
- (5) Traditional bingo, using only cardboard, paper,plastic, or some functionally similar material.
 - (c) The Legislature may authorize a form of gaming activity not included in subsection (b) or increase or decrease the rate of taxation on a gaming activity provided by general law only upon the receipt of a favorable report from the commission recommending such action to the Legislature and the passage of a general bill by a vote of three-fifths of all members elected to each house of the Legislature taken by yeas and nays and entered upon the journals thereof.
 - (d) The commission shall issue licenses for no more than seven gaming establishments, including the license contemplated by Section 65.04, where casino-style games may be played. The commission's issuance of licenses for the gaming establishments shall be subject to procedures and requirements established by general law, including a local approval requirement.
 - (e) Any person that establishes to the satisfaction of the commission that it conducted gaming activities pursuant to the authority of general law or a local provision of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prior to the ratification of



- this amendment may continue to operate until January 1, 2027,
- 86 so long as the person does all of the following:
- 87 (1) Provides the names and addresses of its principal
- owners and investors, business records, and other information

- 90 (2) Provides a sworn statement of its willingness to

- 100 Part 2. Sections 65.01, 65.02, 65.03, 65.04, and 65.05
- 101 are added to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to read as
- 102 follows:
- 103 Section 65.01
- 104 (a) There is established a commission within the
- 105 executive branch of government to protect consumers from
- 106 unscrupulous gaming practices, to ensure the integrity of
- 107 licensed gaming operators, to quickly stop unlawful gaming and
- 108 unlawful gaming-related activities, to mitigate the effects of
- 109 problem gaming, to preserve the aesthetic character of the
- 110 State of Alabama, and to produce revenues that improve the
- 111 quality of life of residents of the state, all pursuant to
- 112 general law.



113 (b) The Legislature, by general law, may provide for
114 the membership, powers, and duties of the commission and shall
115 establish a law enforcement division within the commission to
116 police the conduct of all gaming activities within the state
117 and to effectively eradicate any unlawful gaming activity or
118 unlawful gaming-related activity in this state.

Section 65.02

The Legislature, by general law, may provide for the establishment and regulation of an official state lottery that shall be operated and regulated on behalf of the state by a public corporation as an instrumentality of the state under the supervision of the commission. The Legislature may provide for some portion of the proceeds from the lottery to be used to pay the operating expenses of the lottery, including all prizes, without any appropriation required by law. Net proceeds from the lottery shall be deposited at least annually into the State Treasury and shall be separately appropriated by the Legislature.

Section 65.03

Beginning on the ratification date of this amendment, any future amendment to this constitution applicable to less than the entire state relating to gaming, including lotteries, gift enterprises, casino-style games, sports wagering, raffles, and bingo, may not take effect and shall be void.

137 Section 65.04

(a) The Governor shall negotiate and may execute a

Tribal-State compact with the Poarch Band of Creek Indians for
the operation and regulation of Class III games and sports



wagering on lands held in trust by the United States for the benefit of the Poarch Band of Creek Indians, as provided under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq.

- (b) Following execution of the compact, the Governor shall file the compact with the Secretary of State and the commission. The Secretary of State shall forward an executed copy of the compact to the Secretary of the Interior for review and approval in accordance with, and to the extent required by, federal law.
- (c) In return for the consideration established in the compact contemplated by subsection (a), and for a term as negotiated, the Poarch Band of Creek Indians shall be granted a license, on terms and conditions provided for by general law, to conduct and operate casino-style games at an additional site outside of those lands held in trust.
- (d) The state's immunity to suit in federal court under the Eleventh Amendment to the United States Constitution is expressly waived for the sole purpose of resolving disputes arising under the terms of any compact negotiated pursuant to this section. The waiver of the state's immunity under this section is contingent upon an equivalent submission in the compact by the Poarch Band of Creek Indians to the jurisdiction of federal court.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution, the Legislature, by general law, may grant original jurisdiction to any court in the State of Alabama, including any appellate court, to hear matters concerning



- gaming, including matters in which the commission or lottery corporation or their members, officers, employees, or agents are named parties.

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179 Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as 180 appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional 181 182 paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: 183 change capitalization, hierarchy, spelling, and punctuation 184 for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest 185 grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; revise 186 internal or external citations and cross-references; and

188 END OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

189 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 190 Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws of this 191 192 state. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot 193 number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the 194 election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed 195 196 constitutional amendment:

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197 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama 198 of 2022, to (1) authorize five limited forms of gaming 199 activity: an official state lottery administered by a public 200 lottery corporation, casino-style games played only in person 201 at up to seven locally approved licensed gaming 202 establishments, limited sports wagering, traditional raffles, and traditional paper bingo; (2) establish an Alabama Gaming 203 204 Commission to regulate licensed gaming, stop unlawful gaming 205 and unlawful gaming-related activity, reduce the effects of 206 problem gaming, preserve the State's aesthetic character, and 207 produce revenues that improve residents' quality of life; (3) provide a two-year period for phasing out certain activities 208 209 currently conducted pursuant to local provisions of the 210 Constitution of Alabama of 2022 relating to bingo; and (4) 211 authorize the Governor to execute a compact with the Poarch 212 Band of Creek Indians to regulate gaming activities on tribal 213 land. Proposed by Act ." 214 This description shall be followed by the following 215 216 language: "Yes () No ()." 217

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Section 3. The proposed amendment shall become valid as

a part of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, when approved

by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon.
