4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would authorize a public school to
6	employ or accept as a volunteer a chaplain to provide
7	services to students, provided the chaplain undergoes a
8	criminal history background information check before
9	the chaplain may be employed or accepted as a
10	volunteer.
11	This bill prohibits any individual who has been
12	adjudicated or convicted of an offense that requires
13	registration as a sex offender from working or
14	volunteering as a chaplain in a public school.
15	This bill also requires each local board of
16	education and the governing body of each public charter
17	school to vote on whether to allow schools in their
18	purview to employ or accept a chaplain as a volunteer.

29 education and governing body of a public charter school to 30 vote on whether to allow the employment or volunteer services 31 of a chaplain.

32 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

33 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the 34 term "public school" means any public K-12 school or public 35 charter school.

36 (b) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, a public 37 school may employ or accept as a volunteer a chaplain to 38 provide support, services, and programs for students. A 39 chaplain employed or volunteering under this section is not 40 required to be certified by the State Board of Education.

(c) A public school that employs or accepts a chaplain as a volunteer under this section shall, before the chaplain may begin employment or volunteering, ensure that the chaplain complies with Section 16-22A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to criminal history background information check requirements.

(d) A public school may not employ or accept a chaplain
as a volunteer who has been adjudicated or convicted of an
offense that requires registration as a sex offender under
Chapter 20A of Title 15, Code of Alabama 1975.

(e) Each local board of education and the governing body of each public charter school shall take a record vote no later than April 1, 2025, on whether to adopt a policy authorizing a public school under its purview to employ or accept as a volunteer a chaplain under this section.

55 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 56 1, 2024.
