4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the Alabama Jobs Act
6	provides incentives for certain qualifying business
7	activities to stimulate job creation and capital
8	investment for new and existing businesses within
9	Alabama.
10	This bill would amend the definition of a
11	"renewable energy generation facility" which is an
12	activity eligible for incentives under the Alabama Jobs
13	Act.

16	A BILL
17	TO BE ENTITLED
18	AN ACT
19	
20	Relating to the Alabama Jobs Act; to amend Section
21	40-18-372, Code of Alabama 1975, to amend the definition of a
22	renewable energy generation facility.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 40-18-372, Code of Alabama 1975, is
25	amended to read as follows:
26	" §40-18-372
27	A qualifying project must be found by the Secretary of
28	Commerce to conduct an activity specified in subdivision (1)



and to meet the minimum standard set forth in subdivision (2).

- 31 (1) A qualifying project must predominantly conduct an activity that is any one or more of the following:
- 33 a. Described by NAICS Code 1133, 115111, 2121, 22111,
- 34 221330, 31 (other than 311811), 32, 33, 423, 424, 482, 4862,
- 35 48691, 48699, 48819, 4882, 4883 (other than 48833), 493, 511,
- 36 5121 (other than 51213), 51221, 517, 518 (without regard to
- 37 the premise that data processing and related services be
- 38 performed in conjunction with a third party), 51913, 52232,
- 39 54133 (if predominantly in furtherance of another activity
- described in this article), 54134 (if predominantly in
- 41 furtherance of another activity described in this article),
- 42 54138, 5415, 541614, 5417, 55 (if not for the production of
- electricity), 561422 (other than establishments that originate
- telephone calls), 562213, 56291, 56292, 611512, 927, or 92811.
- b. The production of biofuel as such term is defined in
- 46 Section 2-2-90(c)(2).
- 47 c. A renewable energy generation facility $\underline{\text{may be one of}}$
- 48 the following:
- 1. A facility that is owned by one or more electric
- 50 providers, as the term is defined in Section 37-16-3, for
- 51 providing electric service at retail in Alabama.
- 52 2. A "qualifying facility" (QF) as defined by the
- 53 Energy Information Administration (EIA) as a cogeneration or
- 54 small power production facility that meets certain ownership,
- operating, and efficiency criteria established by the Federal
- 56 Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) pursuant to the Public



57 Utility Regulatory Policies Act (PURPA).

3. An "independent power producer" as defined by EIA as
a corporation, person, agency, authority, or other legal
entity or instrumentality that owns or operates facilities for
the generation of electricity for use primarily by the public.

For purposes of this subdivision, an "electric provider" shall also include an authority as defined in Section 11-50A-1. In the case of an electric provider that is also a tax-exempt organization under the Internal Revenue Code, notwithstanding Section 40-18-376(b)(3), any investment credit may be transferred for the entire term of the project agreement, as approved by the Governor. A "renewable energy generation facility" as used in this subdivision shall include any tangible property that is part of renewable energy generation, including any addition, modification, expansion, or upgrade to transmission or distribution systems that is required to accommodate the interconnection of renewable energy generation.

- d. The conduct of original investigations undertaken on a systematic basis to gain new knowledge or the application of research findings or other scientific knowledge to create new or significantly improved products or processes.
- e. The national or regional headquarters for a company that conducts significant business operations outside the state and that will serve as the principal office of the company _______ principal operating officer with chief responsibility for the daily business operations of the company.

86	efforts pursuant to the Accelerate Alabama Strategic Economic
87	Development Plan adopted in January 2012 by the Alabama
88	Economic Development Alliance, created by Executive Order

g. A type listed in a rule adopted by the Department of Commerce, other than an emergency rule.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, a qualifying project may not engage predominantly in farming activities involving trees, animals, or crops, and a qualifying project may not engage predominantly in the retail sale of tangible personal property or services, and may not be a shopping center, restaurant, movie theater, bowling alley, fitness center, miniature golf course, nightclub, gaming facility, or establishment serving the local community. However, if the excluded activities are not the predominant activity at the project, and if the project is otherwise a qualifying project, then the project agreement may provide that the capital investment may include costs related to excluded activities that are ancillary to the primary business conducted as part of the project. This provision shall not be deemed to exclude customer service centers, call centers or headquarters otherwise allowed by this subdivision.

(2) A qualifying project shall create a significant number of new jobs for the area in which the qualifying project shall be located. Absent a finding of extraordinary circumstances by the Secretary of Commerce, a qualifying



- project shall employ either of the following number of new 113 114 employees: 115 a. Any number of new employees, for a qualifying 116 project in which the predominant activity involves chemical manufacturing, data centers, renewable energy generation, 117 118 engineering, design, or research, metal/machining technology or toolmaking; or 119 120 b. At least 50 new employees, for all other qualifying
